LCUB WATER SYSTEM WIDE FLUSHING PROGRAM

LCUB and the City Fire Department will be conducting our semi-annual water distribution system wide flushing program per Tennessee Department of Environment & Conservation Water Quality Control Requirements. The Flushing Program will occur for the City of Lenoir City on Monday, November 5, 2007, from 2:00 p.m. until 10:00 p.m. and Tuesday, March 6, 2007, from 8:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. The program goals are to identify problems in the water system and ultimately have them corrected.

When fire hydrants are flowed, iron deposits in the water lines get stirred up. This may cause a brown discoloration to the water in the area which is being flushed. This condition is only temporary and will normally correct itself in a number of hours. So during this period of flushing, we recommend that you flow your cold water prior to use to determine if there is any discoloration. While the water is still safe to drink and cook with, we recommend not washing any white clothes without first testing the water for discoloration. If your water is discolored, it will clear up on it's own under normal usage over a period of time. It is also best to limit the use of your hot water until it's clear, as this will keep the iron deposits from going into your hot water heater. Make sure you run your cold water to check to see if it's discolored or not.

You may also notice a drop in water pressure during these times; however, the water pressure should return to normal within a short period of time.

If you continue to experience difficulty with your water pressure or discoloration on Wednesday, November 7, 2007, please contact LCUB at (865) 986-6591 to report the problem.

TBI & 9th Drug Task Force investigation leads to joint State & Federal prosecution of major interstate cocaine enterprise

es. Seven individuals were named in the indictment, including the principal target of a year-long joint TBI/9th DTF investigation, Daniel (aka "Gomez") Schleben, formerly of Lenoir City, but who has lived for some time in the South of the River area of Roane County. Chad Johnson of Lenoir City was also one of the indicted individuals arrested by TBI and 9th DTF who was also being investigated by the Loudon County Sheriff's Office narcotics officers.

The ultimate arrest of Schleben and other members of his alleged drug operation was the result of well over six months of intensive drug surveillance by a local TBI Drug Agent assigned to the 9th Judicial District, as well as other agents of the 9th Drug Task Force. Schleben is alleged to be the major drug supplier of large amounts of cocaine and marijuana to several mid-level drug dealers, including individuals connected with the Black Gangster Disciples in Knox County who were indicted, as well as other mid-level dealers throughout Roane, Loudon, Monroe, McMinn, Morgan and Anderson Counties.

The investigation of Schleben and his activities identified

the individuals who are the subject of the federal indictment as well as others not yet publicly identified as being members of his cocaine and marijuana distribution organization. Other distributors are still being identified as a result of the joint investigation. The overall number of arrests will exceed twenty individuals, many of whom will be prosecuted on federal charges and some of whom will be

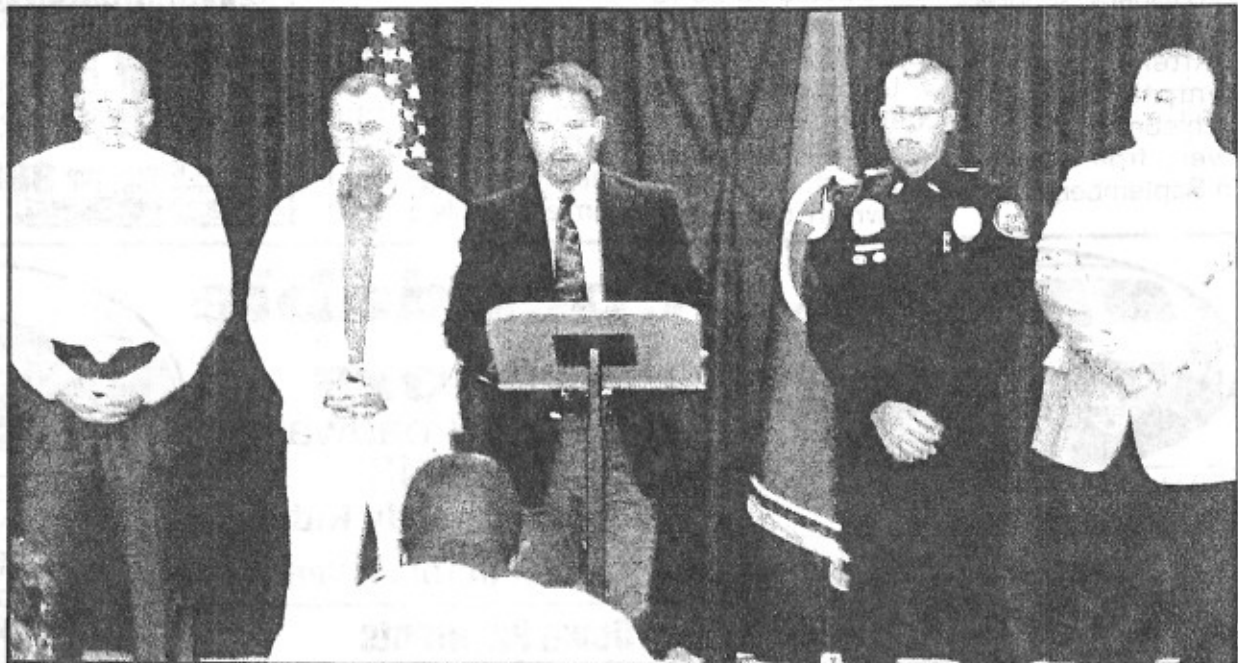
other investigative efforts – that resulted in three arrests by federal agents in Georgia of Schleben's alleged main suppliers. These two separate 'takedowns' in Georgia netted seizures of over \$2.3 million and 53 kilos of cocaine.

The Ninth Judicial District Drug Task Force began intelligence gathering against Schleben in 2005 with information obtained from a confidential informant.

ben started building in the Rockwood area of Roane County in April 2007 with small controlled buys of marijuana from a low level dealer connected with Schleben. The hard work and surveillance by TBI/DTF agents on this case, and information later supplied by the FBI, led to a court approved wiretap of two cell phones and a landline belonging to Schleben.

It soon became apparent that Schleben

of the FBI concerning a potentially related case that they had been investigating involving the Black Gangster Disciples. Through the cooperation and sharing of information between the TBI, 9th DTF, and the FBI the 9th District Attorneys office was able to secure a state wiretap order for the interception of electronic communications of the cell phones of Schleben. TBI and 9th DTF

prosecuted on state charges.

The TBI, 9th DTF, the FBI – Safe Streets Task Force, and HIDTA were able to build a case against Schleben – with most of the critical information coming as a result of the TBI/9th DTF wire taps on cellular phones and

The TBI and the 9th DTF later received information concerning the narcotics distribution organization again in November 2006 through anonymous complaints received through the TBI office in Chattanooga. The main case against Schle-

was a big time supplier with tentacles that stretched throughout East Tennessee with heavy involvement in Knoxville, and even into Georgia, Texas and Mexico. Ultimately local TBI Agent working the case was contacted by the Knoxville office

Agents continued to work the case and with the assistance of the Cookeville TBI Office and agents from the 13th DTF who assisted 9th DTF agents in monitoring the phones from TBI/13th DTF offices in Cookeville. This required tremen-

dous manpower and overtime hours with agents from various local agencies attached to the 9th DTF (Rockwood Police Department, Kingston Police Department, Harriman Police Department, Lenoir City Police Department, Loudon Police Department, Roane County Sheriffs Office and Loudon County Sheriffs Office). One of the DTF agents, who is a native Spanish speaker, was instrumental in interpreting monitored conversations in Spanish between Schleben and his Hispanic suppliers in Georgia.

After several attempts to catch Schleben with a delivery from Georgia in September, federal

agents with the assistance of TBI, 9th DTF and DTF agents from the 10th DTF under District Attorney Steve Bebb, were successful in taking down the Knoxville dealers (Billingsley, Goines, etc), and then Schleben the following day. During these "take downs" Schleben's wife, Stephanie, was detained at their home by 9th DTF agents in the process of counting out over \$75,000 in allegedly illegal drug sale proceeds. Agents seized over \$300,000 in cash from Schleben and his ring, as well as an anticipated 15-20 vehicles and some real property.

Using information developed from the several local arrests resulted in the take-down in Georgia of

Bolivar Perez Camacho aka Jorge, Fidel Dominguez Pineda aka Jesus, and Yolanda Morales Rivera where the largest amounts of cash and cocaine were seized.

Ninth Judicial District Attorney Russell Johnson noted that is "a prime example of multi-agency cooperation from the local, state and federal level across jurisdictional lines and state borders from Rockwood to Knoxville, Roane County to Loudon County, Tennessee to Georgia and even Texas". General Johnson noted that every agency from TBI, the 9th DTF, the 10th DTF, the 13th DTF, HIDTA and FBI deserves credit and I am especially grateful

that we have a United States Attorney like Russ Dedrick who recognizes the need for and significance of this multi-agency cooperation in both the investigation phase and the prosecution phase."

"The federal agents and Assistant USA Tracee Plowell have been cooperative and

helpful to our TBI and DTF agents. For that we are all thankful because a successful federal prosecution of drug dealers always takes the bad guys off of the streets for a longer time and in a manner that is not always possible under the sentencing guidelines of our current state laws".

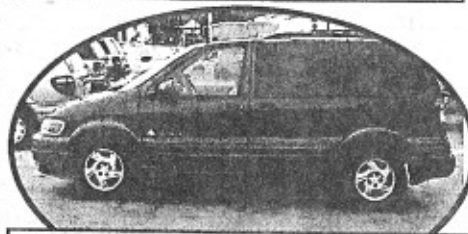

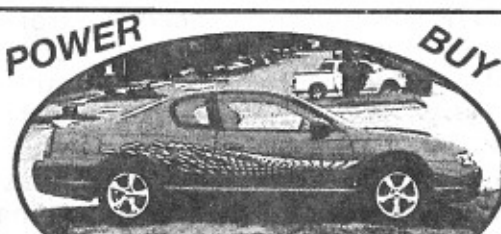
