

Gun season for deer open

Tennessee's deer hunting season, which allows the use of guns, muzzle-loaders, and archery equipment, opened Saturday according to the Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency (TWRA).

The length of the season and bag limit depends on the deer management unit. The season and bag limit for each unit is as follows:

- Unit B Nov. 17-25 & Dec. 15 – Jan. 2; bag limit 2 antlered deer.
- Unit A Nov. 17
 Dec. 2 & Dec. 15 Jan. 6; bag limit 2 ant-lered deer. Some Unit A counties also have non-quota hunts for antierless deer during certain dates. Refer to the list on page 26 of the hunting guide for hunt dates.
- Unit L Nov. 17 - Dec. 2 & Dec. 15 Jan. 6; bag limit 2 antlered deer for the season and 3 antlerless deer per day. A Type 094 permit is required for antlerless deer hunting, except for landowners hunting under the landowner exemption, Sportsman License holders, and hunters who possess a Type 167 permit.

The statewide bag limit for antlered bucks is three per year except a hunter may take no more than two antlered bucks from Unit B. No more than one antlered buck may be

taken per day.

Except for landowners hunting under the landowner exemption, youth under the age of 13, resident senior citizens with a Type 166 License, and Sportsman License holders, deer hunters must possess a big game license for the type of equipment used.

- Big Game Archery License for hunters using archery equipment.
- Big Game Muzzleloader License for hunters using muzzleloaders.
- Big Game Gun License for hunters using modern rifles, handguns, and shotguns.

Anyone born on or after January 1, 1969 is required to carry proof of satisfactory completion of a hunter education class or be in possession of the Apprentice Hunting License (along with other required licenses) while hunting any species in Tennessee.

For more information on hunting deer, refer to the 2007 Tennessee Hunting and Trapping Guide.

Lane and Ferguson searched Mr. Ware's cell and found nothing inside the cell. Mr. Ware still had a strong odor of marijuana about his person. Mr. Ware was asked if he had anything on his person at which time Ware stated he had nothing. Mr. Ware was strip searched again and he removed a small amount of green plant material from his anal cavity. Ware was asked if he had any more and he stated no more. Ware was then placed back into the holding cell. Ware then informed Deputy Ferguson he had some more. Ware was then placed into the restroom where he removed the rest of the bag, which contained more green leafy substance. The substance weighed about .095 grams. After the third time Ware was charged with introduction or possession of weapons, explosives, intoxicants, or drugs into a penal institution.



 Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Wash beets, and place in a roasting pan. Bake for 45 minutes to 1 hour, or until tender. Set aside to cool.

 Melt butter in a large skillet over medium heat. Stir in onion, pears, sugar, and vinegar; cook, stirring frequently, for 20 minutes

When the beets are cool enough to handle, peel and coarsely chop.

4. Puree onion mixture in a food processor with metal blade. Add salt and 1/2 of the beets; pulse 4 to 5 times. Add remaining beets, and pulse 2 to 3 times.
