Chocolate Fruit Clusters

Total time: 20 minutes. Ingredients

8 oz. high-quality semisweet chocolate

1 1/2 C. hazelnuts, coarsely chopped

1/2 C. golden raisins

Step 1:

Line a baking sheet with aluminum foil. Step 2:

In the top of a double boiler, over low heat, stir the chocolate until melted. Remove from the heat and stir in the nuts and raisins. Mix to coat all the pieces. Step 3:

Place heaping

teaspoonfuls of the mixture on the prepared baking sheet. Refrigerate until set. The clusters can be stored in an airtight container in the refrigerator for 1 to 2 months.

Makes about 30 clusters.

To gift wrap these treats, pile them into small, pretty boxes or aluminum pans, wrap with cellophane or plastic wrap, and tie with a bright bow.



Cameras

high definition digital webcam systems on the SmartFIX40 project that will allow anyone with a computer and internet access to view progress on the \$190 million construction project in downtown Knoxville.

The cameras can be viewed by going to the SmartFIX40 website at www.smartfix40.com. Each camera takes a new image approximately every 15 minutes. Each image is then archived into a calendar that can be accessed to monitor construction progress.

Also unique is a time lapse function that shows the entire construction process as it unfolds. One camera has been erected near the Signature Bridge spanning I-40 on Hall of Fame Drive facing downtown. The other camera has been erected near James White Parkway facing east toward the new threelevel interchange.

SmartFIX40 is an accelerated construction process involving the complete closure of a primary roadway to allow around-theclock work that is uninterrupted by traffic in

order to dramatically shorten construction time, thereby reducing the long-term inconvenience to motorists.

During the Smart-FIX40 project, I-40 traffic through Knoxville will be rerouted onto I-640 for 14 months beginning May 2008. Local traffic will have access to downtown at all times during this closure. The closure of I-40 will avoid more than two years of traffic delays, lane closures and other frustrations by allowing construction crews to work on roadways and bridges without traffic.
