Historic

Register of Historic Places. The National Register of Historic Places is the nation's official list of cultural resources worthy of preservation. It is part of a nationwide program that coordinates and supports efforts to identify, evaluate and protect historic resources. The Ten-

nessee Historical Commission administers the program in Tennessee.

Dunbar Public School located in a residential neighborhood southeast of Loudon's courthouse square at 113 Steekee Street was added to the Registry. The circa 1923 school building was constructed in Loudon

(Loudon County) with money from the Julius Rosenwald Fund. Rosenwald, a Sears Roebuck president, set up the fund to help construct schools for African-Americans. This one-story frame school is an adaptation of the Rosenwald Plan #20 designed for two teachers. can school from the time it was built until the Civil Rights era in the late 20th century. The building was frequently used as a community center, hosting a variety of events. According to local sources, the use of the school building for community functions was one reason the St. Peter Masonic Lodge

bought the building after the school closed in 1965.



Brown House in Erwin (Unicoi County), Beech Grove, located outside Nashville (Davidson County), Knickerbocker Apartments in Memphis (Shelby County), the Pippin Roller Coaster in Memphis (Shelby County), and the Robertson Family Farm near Whiteville (Hardeman County).
