
Beer from drive-thru results in damaged building, arrest







accused of going to Cupboard Market, Highland Avenue, to buy beer through a drive-thru window and struck the building before leaving the scene and going to his residence.

The officer located Ramirez and reported Ramirez advised he had gone to the Cupboard to get beer through the drive-thru and struck the building. Ramirez had a strong odor of alcohol about his person and slurred speech.

Ramirez reportedly refused to perform sobriety tasks, telling the officer he'd been arrested for DUI before and failed the test.

The officer further reported a check of Ramirez's information revealed his driving privileges are suspended and Ramirez consented to the implied consent law, but his results showed his sample was insufficient.

port, LCSD Deputy Chris Jenkins was on patrol on I-75 when he saw a vehicle with a missing head light and stopped it, identifying the driver as Wilma Fields Williams.

Williams was said to have had an alcoholic beverage smell about her person and Deputy Jenkins reported he saw several alcoholic

beverages behind the driver's seat and in the passenger side floorboard in plain view.

Wilma Fields Williams, 52, Horton Road, Surgoinsville, TN was charged with possession of legend drugs, possession of schedule II drugs (Hydros) and posses-

sion of schedule IV (Valium).



