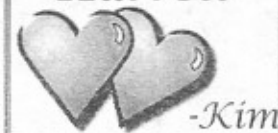

show cause why they were in contempt of temporary restraining order the company had placed on union members February 5, 2007. The company alleges members violated the temporary restraining order by blocking entrances and exits to the company's Maremont facility to harassing replacement (SCAB) workers the company has hired since the strike began and also engaging in supplier obstruction. Union members accused of these allegations vigorously deny an wrong doing and allege the company security has initiated acts of intimidation themselves. While in court however, Maremont attorneys asked for a continuance from Chancellor Frank Williams in Roane County. According to sources present at the hearing Chancellor Williams stated "he hoped both parties could work it (the strike) out peacefully." He then reset the hearing to

February 23, 2007.

To back up Union claims of intimidation, eye witnesses reported on Monday at approximately 5pm while company security was video taping union members, one of the security vehicles struck a union members vehicle and then attempted to leave the scene. Officers from LPD responded to the scene and filed an incident since the damage was minimal.

After repeated attempts to verify Maremont's position on the incident(s) General Operations Manager Timothy Sayers chose to hang up on reporters instead of commenting.

Maremont representatives along with Local IAM 2545 have scheduled talks to begin this Thursday on a new collective bargaining agreement at an undisclosed location. Community support for the striking union members has been overwhelming. Donations have been made by LCUB, LUB, Food City, Loudon Funeral

Home, James' Body Shop, and countless members of the community. In addition, a family walk is planned for Monday, in support of union members should talks fail on Thursday.

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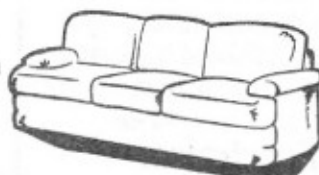

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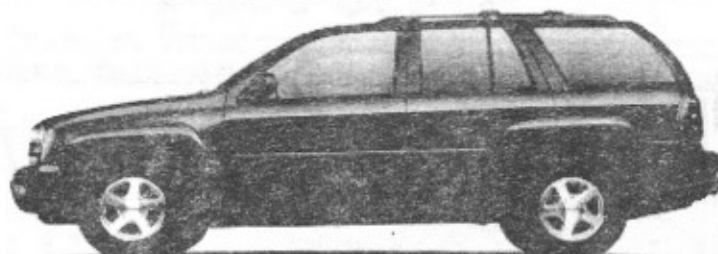
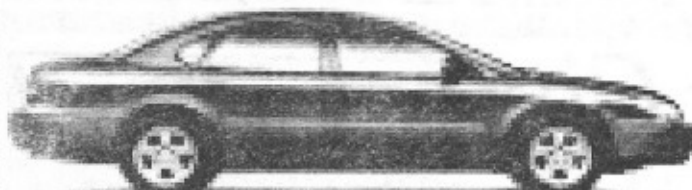
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
