William Irving Donaldson, age 84 of the Tellico Village Community in Loudon, TN, passed away in Knoxville, TN, (University of Tennessee Medical Center) February 25, 2007. He was born in Detroit, MI, but moved with his parents to Huntington, WV, where he graduated

from high school. Prior to receiving a congressional appointment to the United States Naval Academy from South Carolina, he attended the Tennessee Military Institute at Sweetwater, TN. He graduated in June, 1946 as a member of the class of 1947. After graduation, he served on destroyers, completed naval flight

training and flew as a Hurricane Hunter, served as an instructor at the United States Naval Academy, flew blimps, retiring from the Navy in 1966. He obtained a Masters degree in Education from Penn State, subsequently serving as an Assistant Professor at Penn State. He retired from teaching in 1982 and moved

to his retirement home in Gaylord, MI, eventually moving to Loudon, TN, in 1996. He was a University of TN Master Gardener and antique clock repairer.
