## Reminder

more than five digits of anyone's credit card number or the card's expiration date on receipts. The new consumer law (Tennessee Code Annotated § 47-18-126) applies to receipts given to the customer and retained by the merchant. The Attorney General has the authority to enforce any violations of the law.

Attorney General Cooper is sending letters and copies of the new law to various associations who represent businesses such as hotels, restaurants, grocery stores, gas stations, doctors' offices and retail businesses to alert them of the new law and ask for their compliance.

"We want to remind businesses to com-

ply with this new law to protect consumers from identity theft, which may occur when complete credit card information is printed and stolen."

said Attorney General Cooper. "The Federal Trade Commission estimates thieves steal the identities of 10 million Americans each year. The result is lost time and money to repair a consumer's good name and credit history."

"While nothing can guarantee that you won't become a victim of identity theft, you can minimize your risk, and minimize the damage if a problem develops, by making it more difficult for thieves to access your personal information," Division of Consumer Affairs Director Mary Clement said. "If you

have been a victim of identity theft or know of businesses that are still printing credit card receipts with more than five digits and/or the expiration date, please contact the Division of Consumer Affairs at [www.state.tn.us/consumer](http://www.state.tn.us/consumer) or call 1-800-342-8385 to file a complaint."

Consumers can take simple steps to protect their credit from identity theft. Carefully, review your credit, debit and bank account records. If you do not recognize a charge, notify your creditor and question the charge. Also, notify your creditor if your bills do not arrive on time. A missing credit card bill could mean an identity thief has taken over your credit card account and changed the address to cover his or her tracks. De-

stroy all unnecessary files containing Social Security numbers, account numbers, and birth dates before disposing of them. Shred documents containing private information and install hard drive shredding software to destroy your hard drive before discarding a home computer.

If you are a victim of identity theft, call the police and the bank or the credit card issuer immediately in addition to notifying the three major credit reporting agencies. The Federal Trade Commission provides valuable information including steps to take in reporting and resolving the crime of identity theft at [www.consumer.gov/idtheft](http://www.consumer.gov/idtheft).

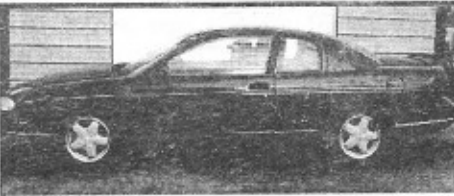

she had returned home to find her front basement door open and items thrown about the area. She left the premises and summoned law enforcement who arrived and cleared the residence.

Detectives were called to the scene and it was reported the entire residence, along with a guest house on the property, had been completely demolished. All the drawers and closets in every room but one were opened and the contents removed and thrown about the area.

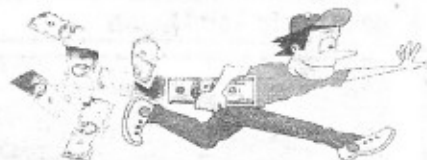

Haynes reportedly said he went to "Brewster's," and asked if it was any of his people who could have done it when they were trimming trees and Brewster told him it wasn't his people, that it must have been LCUB people.

Haynes said he then went to LCUB and they told him it wasn't them, it must have been Brewster's (people).

The officer noted Haynes advised the fence, a three strand fenced, had been somewhat put back together, but not good to have kept his cows in if he hadn't found it.

No other information was available at the time of the report.

## Calderon

was charged with DUI 2nd, driving on revoked, poss. of sch. VI for resale, and implied consent. According to the report, Officer Blake Norman, LPD observed a white Buick on Hwy 11 at Overlook Dr. speeding 66mph in a 45mph zone. The officer made a traffic stop and identified the driver as Oscar Calderon. He had

very slurred speech and reported he had taken some hydrocodone prior to that night. Calderon had a temporary restricted license. Calderon reported he had taken his girlfriend home, which made his driving privilege invalid.

Calderon was unsteady on his feet and performed poorly on sobriety tests. During an inventory of the vehicle the officer found a baggie full of a green leafy substance believed to

be marijuana in the passenger floorboard and was in three separate packages. The substance weighed approximately one ounce.

Calderon was found to have a prior DUI in 2006 and he denied all BAC tests. Officer Blake Norman, LPD made the arrest.

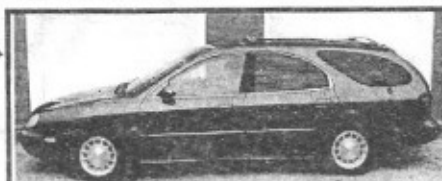

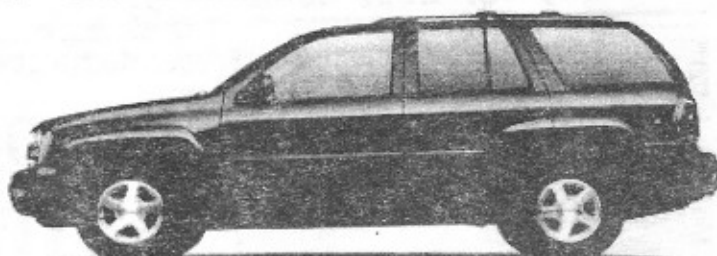
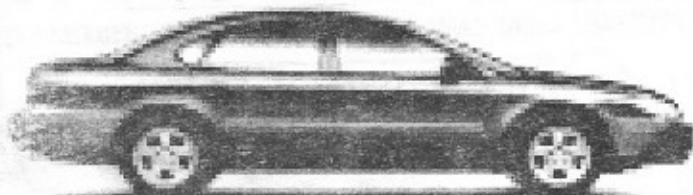
