On Tuesday, February 27 the Lenoir City Fire Dept. responded to a blaze that was reported in a section of brush just east of the Loudon County Justice Center on Highway 11.

An off-duty officer, Brad Rayfield, was the first to call in the fire to the first responders. Upon arriving at the scene firefighters were greeted by approximately 30' flames and the blaze was rapidly spreading.

The fire fighters were

able to bring the blaze under control quickly and other than a patch of scorched earth, no other property damage occurred.

Said one official, "We were lucky we got here when we did. It looked like it (the fire) was spreading to

the thicker brush and that would have been a lot worse."

It was speculated that a passing motorist disposing of a cigarette may have inadvertently triggered the blaze.

first federal weights and measures act on March 2, 1799.

In 1870, Tennessee's first state weights and measures law was enacted, and for more than 100 years the Tennessee Department of Agriculture (TDA) has been minding the store — making sure that the products you buy weigh, hold or measure what they should. State Agriculture officials are joining the National Conference on Weights and Measures (NCWM) in recognizing National Weights & Measures Week, Mar. 1 -7, to remind consumers and businesses of the importance of equity in the marketplace.

Tennessee, like many other states, partners with the NCWM to create fair and equitable national standards. State weights and measures officials ensure that these standards are met by conducting inspections of weighing and measuring devices at various establishments across the state. Officials also help ensure that

products and services sold by weight or measure comply with state laws by conducting random price verification and net weight inspections.

TDA Weights and Measures administrator Bob Williams suggests that consumers:

1. Check that pumps and scales always begin on zero prior to the start of their transaction,

2. Note that all packaged commodities should clearly state the net quantity (ounces, pounds, quarts, liters, etc) on the package, and

3. Pay attention to the price of items being scanned to ensure pricing accuracy.

If you note a problem, Williams says to first talk with store personnel and give them a chance to correct the problem. If the problem is not explained or corrected to your satisfaction, you should immediately contact the state Weights and Measures office to provide a detailed explanation of the issue. Following the completion of an inspection, the Weights and Measures office will provide a report

of their findings upon request.
