Discovered in Shirk's pocket were two plastic bags, one containing 26 white pills identical to the ones (Xanax) found during the traffic stop, along with one white pill believed to be Methadone. The other bag contained seven purple and white capsules also identical to the ones (Morphine) found in the traffic stop.

Officer Yates charged Carol Leann Shirk, 36, Grimes Road Loudon with possession of schedule IV (Valium), possession of schedule IV (Xanax) for resale, possession of schedule II (Morphine) for resale, and possession of schedule II (Methadone).



that her boyfriend, Mark Anthony Stevens, pulled a knife on her, told her he would kill her, cut her panties off, choked her leaving red marks on her neck and face, then told her if she tried to leave he would kill her. He then started ramming her head and body into the walls while still holding the knife on her.

Later, at Fort Sanders Hospital, Sqt. David Flynn, LCPD reported that Stevens was at the hospital and was told several times to stand up and place his hands behind his back, that he was under arrest on an aggravated assault warrant stemming form the knife attack on his girlfriend. 




