Created in 1978 by the General Assembly, TACIR is a future-oriented organization concerned with improving the efficiency and effectiveness of governments in the intergovernmental process.

According to statute, the commission is directed to study, report on, and make recommendations concerning the current pattern of local government structure and its viability; the powers and functions of local governments, including fiscal powers; the allocation of state and local fiscal resources; the relationship between and among local governments and

the state; the role of the state as creator of local governmental entities; and relationship improvement between state and local governments.

TACIR is made up of 25 members including representatives of the General Assembly, executive branch, city and county governments, and private citizens.

Serving his sixth term in the state Senate, McNally serves as Chairman of the Senate Finance, Ways and Means Committee. He is also the Vice Chairman of the Senate Rules Committee and a member of the Senate General Welfare, Health and Human Resources Committee.

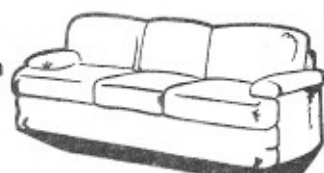

an unsafe speed. In doing so, Brookshear nearly hit small children walking across the parking lot. Brookshear then stopped at the stop sign, and "power braked" the vehicle resulting in the rear wheels breaking traction and leaving a trail of tire dust several feet long and smoke.

Brookshear's actions were in willful disregard for the safety of persons or property. This narrative was written as a result of evidence viewed at the scene by Officer Harrison, and statements given by several witnesses and victims at the scene.
