





any tax online, and many tax registration applications for business taxes are available electronically.

The individual income tax, commonly known as the Hall income tax, and franchise and excise taxes are due in April. Tennessee taxpayers will have until Tuesday, April 17, to file these state taxes normally due April 15.

In order to assist its customers with electronic filing, the Department of Revenue provides computer

access to customers. so they can file their taxes online at its offices in Chattanooga, Knoxville, Jackson, Johnson City, Memphis and Nashville. The department also offers an electronic commerce hot line to assist taxpayers and tax practitioners who use the department's ever-expanding suite of electronic tax filing options. The statewide toll-free phone number is (866) 368-6374. Nashville-area and out-of-state callers should dial (615) 253-0704.

In addition to using the state's Web portal, taxpayers may file sales tax electronically using software available through one of several certified software providers. Visit Revenue's Web site, www.Tennessee. gov/revenue, to learn more about the wide array of electronic filing options.

Also available on Revenue's Web site is information about electronic filing options for motor fuel

taxes and information about electronic funds transfer.

All taxpayer data, whether paper or electronic, filed with the Department of Revenue is confidential and protected under Tennessee law.

hunting opportunities on the agency's WMAs, all of which have information about them in TWRA's 2006-07 Tennessee Hunting & Trapping Guide, pages 18 through 20.

The 2006 hunting guide outlines bag limits and regulations. It also discusses the Young Sportsman Hunt set for March 24-25, a week before the season opens to all other hunters.

Remember, all turkeys harvested must be checked out at the nearest county or WMA checking station. Only shotguns .20 gauge larger (or archery equipment) is allowed for turkey hunting, while only shot size number 4 or smaller is legal in Tennessee.

Cardoza Alejandron Perez, 27, of Babcock St. Tellico Plains, was charged with public intoxication.


According to the report, Perez was a passenger in the vehicle and had a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage on his person and it would have been unsafe for him to walk home to Tellico




