

On February 24th Lambert wrote a check to Bob's Market in the amount of \$47.49 that was also on the victims closed

However, historically, there is no true

date that the Friday the 13th superstition can be linked to.

The superstiton effects people and cultures in various ways:

It's been estimated that [U.S] \$800 or \$900 million is lost in business on this day because people will not fly or do business they would normally

Some people are

so paralyzed by fear that they are simply unable to get out of bed when Friday the 13th rolls around. The Stress Management Center and Phobia Institute estimates that more than 17 million people are affected by a fear of this day. Despite that, representatives for both Delta and Continental Airlines say that their airlines don't suffer from any noticeable drop in travel on those Fridays.
