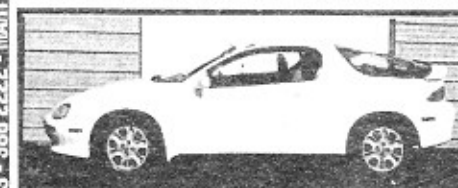

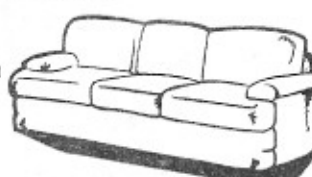

The web site, [www.eeintennessee.org](http://www.eeintennessee.org), contains contact information for more than 90 organizations that provide environmental education in Tennessee, as well as facts and statistics on the environment, an E-quiz, and an interactive calendar page with environmental education activities across the state. Activities are included for children, youth and adults and most are free.

The Environmental Education in Tennessee Web site is designed to be particularly useful for teachers looking for field trip opportunities, guest speakers,

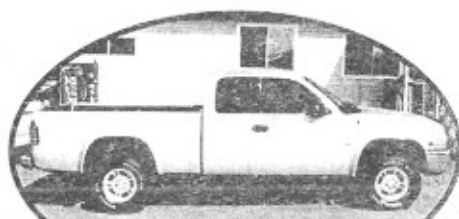

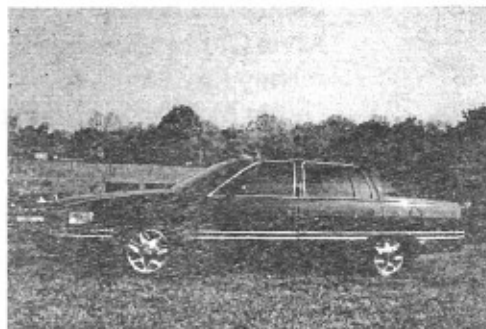
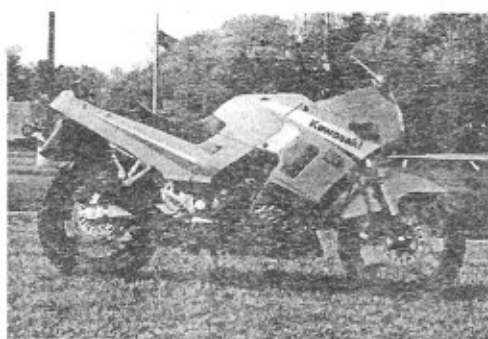

The following business was voted on and a consensus reached by the Grand Jurors:

## **2. Lenoir City Utilities Board Investigative Audit**

The District Attorney General presented for the Grand Jury's review and consideration the results of an Investigative Audit of the Lenoir City Utility Board performed by the Comptroller's Office. The District Attorney General presented Phillip Job from the Comptroller's Office as a witness (who was the managing auditor and fraud expert) on the LCUB investigative audit. The DAG Russell Johnson had previously requested and Judge E. Eugene Eblen appointed Bill Bright, General Counsel from the Comptroller's Office as a *pro tem* prosecutor to assist in the presentation of the audit portion dealing with the Dixie Lee Utility-LCUB merger.

The Grand Jury agreed with the assessment of Auditor Job that the findings labeled "Other Issues" in the audit were violations of LCUB policy and not subject to criminal prosecution. However, the consensus was to request the DA to subpoena the appropriate official from LCUB to present a follow-up to the August Grand Jury as to what corrective measures have been taken or implemented to make sure future violations of policy do not occur.

The Grand Jury found the aspects of "Indirect Conflict of Interest" on the part of the former Dixie-Lee Utility commissioners disturbing when they voted their former entity out of existence with the knowledge that they would probably be entering into highly unusual 40 year personal service agreements as an indirect result of their voting to merge with LCUB. The Grand Jury understands from both General pro tem Bill Bright's and DA Russell Johnson's assertion that the two-year statute of limitations on charges such as official misconduct would bar criminal prosecution of these individuals, if a case for official misconduct could even be proven given that the entire merger proceeding and execution of personal service agreements were conducted under the advice of legal counsel for both LCUB and Dixie-Lee Utilities.

The consensus of the Grand Jury was to concur with DA Johnson and General Bright's suggestion that DA Johnson meet with legal counsel for LCUB to determine the exact status of the pending LCUB Chancery Court litigation and to consider the possibility of a *quo warranto* action to possibly recover any monies paid unlawfully by LCUB, if the present LCUB action does not contemplate the same type of relief. The Grand Jury would also request the DA to subpoena the individuals from the former Dixie-Lee Utility commission to appear before the August Grand Jury if the DA's analysis of the audit warrants further investigation.

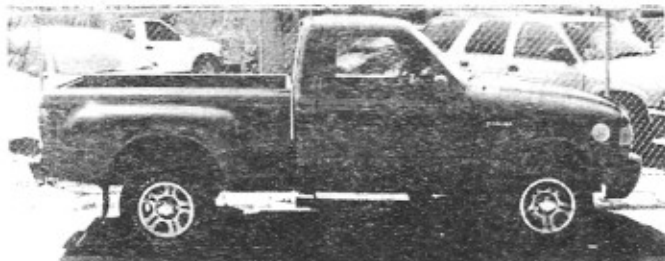
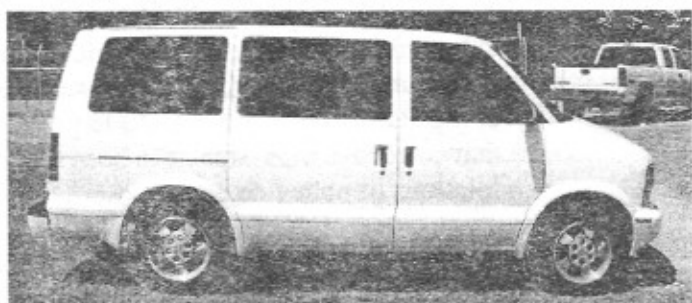
