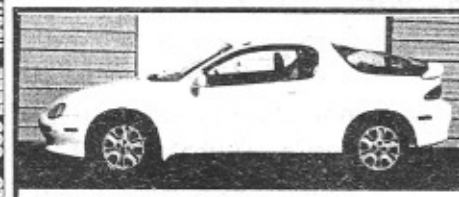

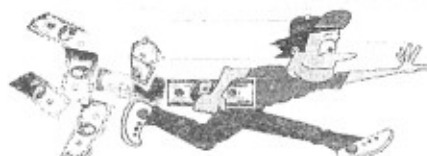

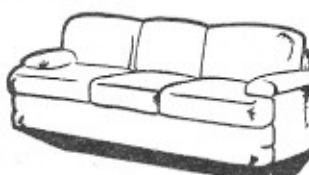

The K-9 alerted on the right side of an entertainment center found in Martin's room. While searching the entertainment center Sgt. 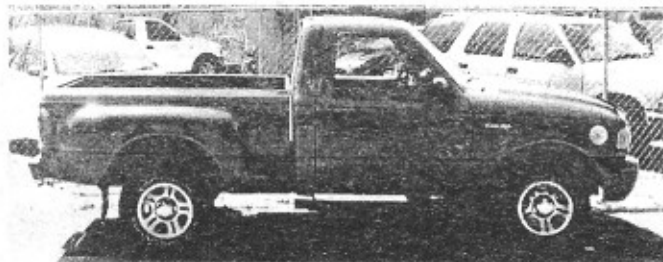
