This office has received a number of phone calls and questions from the press since the Tennessee Criminal Court of Appeals' reversal of Judge Buddy Scott's dismissal of the extortion

charges against Loudon County Chief Deputy Tony Aikens. At least one press source, as well as a message (on Thursday morning) from the Director of the DA's Conference), were suggesting that Johnson's office would somehow have a role (see Case pg. 6)

in the matter, even though there was a special prosecutor, Ed Bailey, appointed who handled the case at the trial level. As a result of the inquires, District Attorney General Russell Johnson and two of his assistants, Frank Harvey and Bill Reedy, contacted the State Attorney General to seek guidance and clarification as to the aspects of the case on remand.

According to Assistant State Attorney General John Bledsoe, who handled the case on appeal, there

is still a sixty-four day period from when the appeal judgment is filed before the Clerk formally remands the case back to the Loudon County Criminal Court Clerk Lisa Niles and Special Judge Scott. At that time, also according to Bledsoe, Special Prosecutor Bailey has the option of either pursuing or dismissing the prosecution of the case. After receiving this explanation Assistant DA's Frank Harvey and Bill Reedy, at General Johnson's request, then contacted Bailey who confirmed that he was remaining on the case as District Attorney General pro tem and that he would handle inquiries from members of the press about the case.

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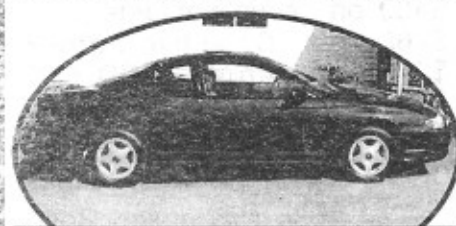
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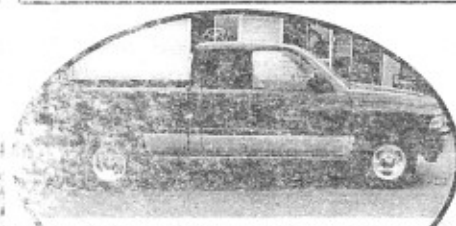
2005 Dodge Neon, 4dr, auto, AC, low miles \$8995



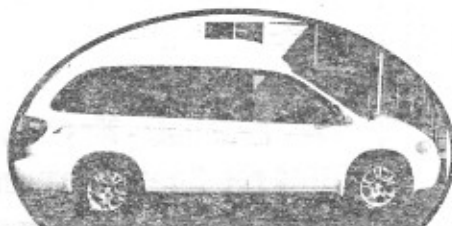
