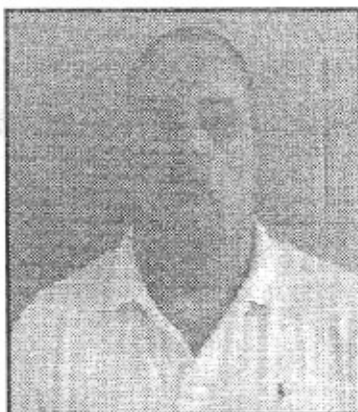


Dandridge man charged after scamming local woman

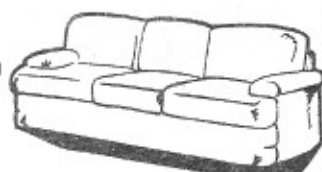

Police arrested a Lenoir City woman Saturday after she allegedly went on a drunken rampage, assaulted a man, then kidnapped two women, one of whom she is also accused of assaulting, at her home. A second woman was charged after she obstructed police and was disorderly.

Cynthia Ann Fey Walters, 46, of Forest Heights Circle, with third offense DUI, leaving the scene and simple possession of marijuana by Trooper J. F. Holcomb, THP, and two counts of kidnapping, two counts of assault and one count of reckless endangerment by Investigator Chris White, LCSD CID.

According to multiple affidavits, around Walters was at a Silo Drive residence where she got into an altercation with a Friendsville man. When the man got his cell phone out to call 911, Walters hit him in the jaw, knocking the phone to the ground where she proceeded to try to stomp on it to prevent the man from calling 911. She then got into her truck and backed into a vehicle parked in the

driveway.

The man told police when Walters started forward he thought she was leaving and he started to get into his vehicle when she put her truck in reverse and started hitting his vehicle with him in it. She then fled the scene.

Walters drove to her residence and the truck she had been driving was found behind the house next to hers. At least three witnesses told police she had been driving at the time of the crash. A search of the truck produced a small amount of what was believed to be marijuana found in a cup holder.

Deputy Chris Bowen, LCSD, responded to the residence and reported he could no response from inside the home despite several attempts to get someone to come to the door. While he and other officers were there a woman identified as 21 year old Ashley Renee Silverberg, also of the residence, arrived and entered the home.

A short while later, Silverberg exited the residence and police

asked her if Walters was inside or if there were any weapons in the home. Silverberg told police she wasn't answering any of their questions then became upset and began yelling and crying.

Deputy Bowen placed Silverberg under arrest and charged her with obstruction of service of process and disorderly conduct.

Upon making verbal contact with the occupants, Walters refused to come out, forcing police to enter the residence with weapons drawn. Upon making contact with Walters and two other women inside the residence it was learned Walters had fled to her residence where she ran inside with a North Cedar Bluff Road woman.

While police were outside attempting to make contact with someone inside the home, Walters had forced the woman into the master bathroom where she told her to shut up and sit down. Walters also woke up another woman sleeping at the home, told her the cops were at the residence, and then made her go to the master bedroom where she told her to get down and shut up until the cops went away.

The second woman was in fear of what would happen if she didn't comply so she did as she was told. The first woman, however, attempted to leave the bathroom and Walters jumped on her and hit her in the face multiple times, breaking her necklace in the process. The woman said she tried to scream so someone would hear her and come in, but Walters told her she'd choke the life out of her.

Walters reportedly told officers she'd

had a beer, a shot of whiskey and some other mixed drinks. She was uncooperative and combative when placed under arrest by Trooper Holcomb. The arrest occurred at approximately 11:36 a.m.

Assisting officers included Assistant Chief Deputy Jimmy Davis and Deputy Dewayne Drinnen.

Phillip Dale Cline, 38, of Postoak Valley Road, Rockwood, was charged with VOP and failure to appear.

According to the affidavit, Cline was convicted of DOSL and sentenced to probation for 6 months.

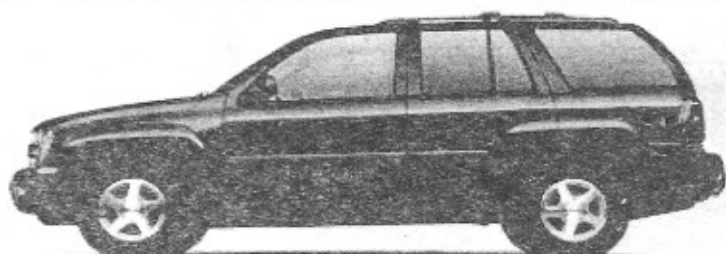
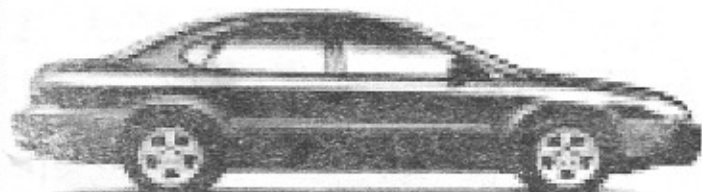
