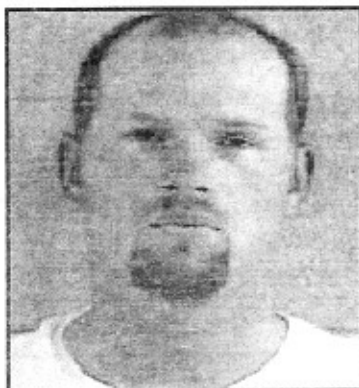

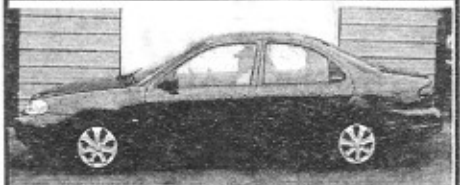

rants, filed by Deputy Brad Rayfield, LCSD on February 18, 2007 at 9pm, while on routine patrol, the deputy observed a black Pontiac Firebird with an old style out of date tag on it with a very loud muffler, driving down Hwy. 321 toward Lenoir City. The vehicle was suspected to be driven by Mitchell Brown and his license is suspended. The officer activated his lights and siren and stopped the vehicle at Hwy. 321 in front of Bimbo's. As the officer exited his patrol car, Mitchell took off at a high rate of speed on Shaw Ferry Road. Deputy Rayfield pursued the Firebird at speeds up to 70 mph and witnessed the driver run through stop signs and turn right on Old Hwy. 45 at an extreme high rate of speed. The deputy pursued the vehicle toward Roane County on Hwy. 70 at speeds in excess of 120 mph and the vehicle passed three vehicles on double yellow lines, forcing motorists off the road and endangering the lives of people in the vehicles.

At that time the officer terminated pursuit of the vehicle on Hwy. 70 for safety of the public and officers involved. Two days later, Deputy Daniel Kelly made contact with Mitchell Owen Brown and he admitted to Deputy Kelly over the phone to driving the

black Firebird that evaded the police. A check through NCIC confirmed Brown's license was suspended. After further investigation the tag came back to a 1990 Dodge belonging to a Kingston man.

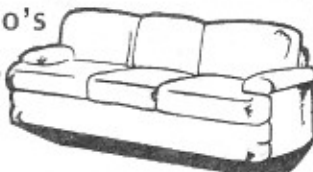
