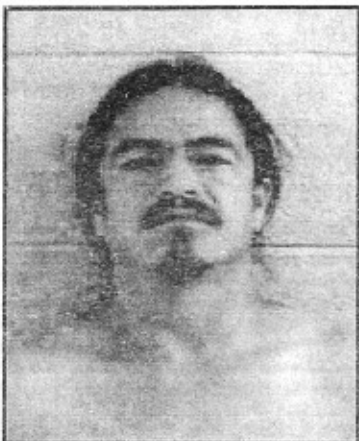

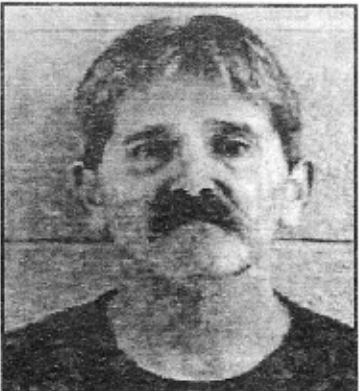

## Busted

9th DTF and LCSD make bust in Loudon  
On April Sunday Investigator John "Bronze Bomber" Sanchez 9th Judicial Drug Task Force and Sgt. Jeff "everybody's my cousin" Russell,

LCSD were conducting an aggravated assault investigation at 5052 Calloway Road, Loudon. They obtained consent from Javier Llanas Hernandez Duarte, a resident of the property, to search the house for any contraband or

items related to the alleged assault.

As a result of the search they found three separate zip-lock bags containing blocks of a green leafy substance, believed to be marijuana weighing approximately one ounce

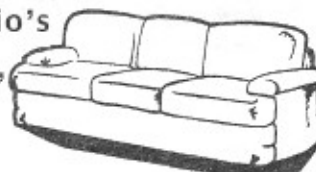

departments understand the application process for the 2008 grant cycle for three programs.

The process for submitting applications for three grant programs will be reviewed:

Local Parks and Recreation Fund (LPRF) Grants provide funding for the purchase of lands for parks, natural areas, greenways and the

purchase of land for recreational facilities. Funds may also be used for trail development and capital projects in parks, natural areas and greenways. Each county government and incorporated municipality is allowed to submit one grant application per cycle. Cities and counties may apply jointly for one project in addition to applying for one city or county project, but a government that currently has an open project in this category of programs is not eligible to reapply until the open project is completed.

Land and Water Conservation Funds (LWCF) Grants provide matching grants to states and through

the state to local governments and state agencies that provide recreation and parks for the acquisition and development of public outdoor recreation areas and facilities.

Recreational Trails Program (RTP) Grants are provided through the federal Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act. The Department of Environment and Conservation administers this program in Tennessee, and the grants may be used for non-routine maintenance and restoration of existing trails, development and rehabilitation trailside or trailhead facilities such as restrooms, shelters and parking

lots, construction of new trails and acquisition of land for recreational trails or corridors. Federal, state and local government agencies may apply.
