"Early results show they do. indeed, save energy and may be a useful energy conservation tool under certain applications. But we do not presently finance radiant barriers in our energy conservation c:ogram, nor does A promote or ennorse specific energy conservation prod-Jots."

Radiant barriers are reflective aluminum ilms which are instailed in home at-

tics to reflect summer heat back outside and keep winter heat inside. TVA is performing field tests in a total of 60 homes in Tupelo, Mississippi, and Hopkinsville, Kentucky, to determine if radiant barriers should be included as an option under the Energy Package.

"Our tests show that very few people would find it cost effective to pay more than 20 cents per square foot for radiant barrier materials." Carver said. "Yet we have reports of a company selling the material for more than 60 cents per square foot."

"Most manufacturers of radiant barriers market their products accurately and ethically," Carver


