Wreck sends one to hospital

On Thursday August, 23rd, police from LCPD along with rescue workers from the Lenoir City Fire Dept. and Rural Metro EMS were dispatched to McGhee Blvd. in front of Walgreens in response to a call of a wreck. Upon arrival. the rescue workers found a grey, 1999 Ford car being driven by Cindy Williams, that had left the roadway and crashed. Evidence at the scene indicated that Williams left the road and travelled up an enbankment before going airborne and then crashed nosefirst into a ravine.

Due to the location of the crash it was several minutes before rescue workers could extricate Williams from the vehicle. Several trees had to be removed from the crash sight to allow the rescue workers access to the scene. The extent of Williams injuries

was not known, but all precautions possible were taken during her removal from the vehicle. Williams was transported by Rural Metro Ambulance service to a local hospital for further
