



pier near the river had settled 3 1/2 inches.

Tennessee Department of Transportation spokeswoman Pamela Marshall said the traffic was moving in both directions on the bridge's eastbound span. The span had recently undergone improvements while the westbound span carried traffic. River bridges have been under scrutiny across the country since the August 1 collapse of

the I-35W bridge over the Mississippi River in Minneapolis killed 13 people. That bridge was undergoing repairs when it fell during the evening rush hour, dropping dozens of cars more than 60 feet into the Mississippi.

Evidently T-DOT felt that everything was fine, because the bridge is back open now.
