

any and all documents that had been taken from LCSD immediately.

Sheriff Guider placed Bill Shirk on paid administrative leave and scheduled a Show Cause hearing Chattanooga, Michael, to give Shirk the opportunity to state his reasons for not being disciplined. Shirk appeared at the hearing without an attorney. Based on the facts presented along with Shirk's own admittance Sheriff Guider rendered his decision Friday, July 27 to discharge Captain Shirk from LCSD.

> The file removed by Shirk and taken to a friends house contained weekly jail security reports, requisitions, and time sheets just to name a few.

> Shirk has, since his termination, hired Attorney Herbert Moncier to represent him at the Merit Service Board.

> Prior to this termination in 2005 Shirk had been terminated for his treatment of inmates and coworkers and several other things including making inappropriate comments to co

workers. Shirk found a loop hole with the Merit Service Board which wasn't active at the time. Sheriff Guider did the only thing he could do and that was to hire Shirk back since Shirk didn't have an opportunity to defend himself. Numerous complaints, phone calls and letters from inmates, co-workers and other agencies have been received over the last 3+ years against Captain Shirk even to this newspaper.

From Section 2.12 of the Loudon County Governmental Policy and Procedure handbook it states employees must comply with laws relating to governmental records. Employees should be aware that it is a crime to alter, falsify, destroy or tamper with governmental records pursuant to TCA 39-16-504, which provides 3(b) A violation of this section is a Class A Misdemeanor (c)(1) upon notification from any public official having custody of government records including those created ...that records have been unlawfully removed from a government records office, appropriate legal action may be taken. The only action taken thus far by the Sheriff was termination of Shirk and the return of the documents.


