Heatstroke occurs when the body fails to regulate its own temperature and body temperature continues to rise, often to 105° (40.6°) or higher. Signs of rapidly

progressing heatstroke include:

Unconsciousness for longer than a few seconds.

Convulsion (seizure).

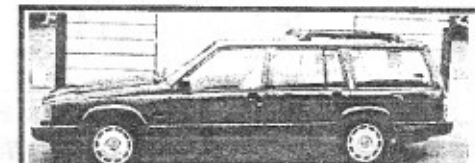

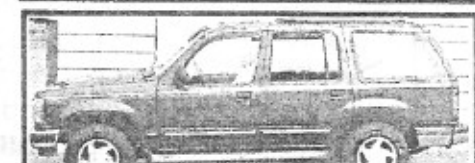

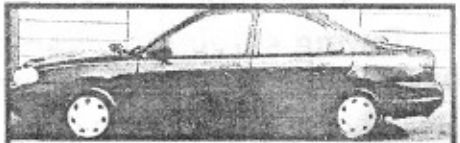

Robert L. (Bob) Patterson, of the Tellico Village Community, Loudon, TN, formerly of Houston, TX, passed away August 5 after fighting a courageous battle with cancer. Born in Brooklyn, NY, he graduated from Spring Branch High School, Houston, TX, in 1976. Accepting a scholarship to play basketball at Ole Miss, he attended from 1976-1978, lettering both years. Led by a close personal friend, Bob accepted Christ as personal Savior in 1978. He transferred from Ole Miss to Delta State University in 1979 where he met Trisha whom he later married in 1981. Bob attended Piedmont Baptist College from fall 1979 to the end of summer 1980 and later graduated from the University of Houston in 1983 with a degree in mathematics. His professional career started at Texaco, Inc., in 1981, where he began as a computer operator, later being promoted to geophysicist. In 1987, Bob's computer consulting profession began in St. Louis, MO, at McDonnell Douglas in 1989. Bob and Trisha started a computer consulting firm, Digital Consulting & Software Services, Inc. (DCSS), in 1990 in Houston, TX, which grew to over 265 employees nationwide and ranked #108 in the 1994 Inc 500s list of the nations fastest growing firms. In 1999, Bob was instrumental in establishing DCSS Ability, a

computer firm focused on training and employing people with disabilities. He served as a member of their Board of Directors until the sale of this company in 2007. In 2002, Bob and Trisha were named Entrepreneurs of the Year for computer consulting by Ernest & Young. In 2006, 75 percent of DCSS was sold, while the remaining part of the company, LabAnswer, continues to focus on the automation of laboratories. Bob served as a member of the Board of Directors since its inception, and as COO of LabAnswer. Elected to the Board of Directors of Bill Glass Champions for Life in 2001, a 35-year-old prison ministry sharing Christ with the inmate population, in 2007 he was elected Chairman of the Board. In 2005, Bob was elected to the Board of Trustees at Piedmont Baptist College and Graduate School, Winston Salem, NC, where he received the Male Alumnus Award for 2007; the Patterson Wing of Lee Hall has also been named for Bob and Trisha. He was preceded in death by his father, William W. Patterson. He is survived by his wife of 26 years, Trisha; mother, Nadine Patterson, brother Bill Patterson and wife Linda, sister Kathy Chase and husband Michael, all of Houston, TX; nieces Lauren, Amanda, and Sara Patterson and Meagan Chase of Houston, TX, and Melissa and Amanda Molgaard of

Tellico Village; nephews Stephen Millsaps, Knoxville, TN, and Michael Chase, Houston, TX; grand-nephew Phoenix Oliver Chase, Houston, TX; spiritual nephews Joshua Hawkins, Matthew Wilson, Jeremy Burgin, and Matthew Piers of Knoxville, TN, and spiritual niece Kym Warda, Denver, CO. Funeral services will be held at Sevier Heights Baptist Church, Knoxville, TN, Thursday, August 9, at 6:00 p.m. with Dr. Charles Pettit, president of Piedmont Baptist College and Graduate School,

officiating. The family will receive friends after the service. Burial will be Friday, August 10, at 11:00 a.m. at Lake View Cemetery, Lenoir City, TN, with Rich Thomson, pastor of Grace Bible Church, Houston, TX, officiating. In lieu of flowers, memorial donations may be made to Piedmont Baptist College and Graduate School, Winston Salem, NC, and to Bill Glass Champions for Life, Dallas, TX. 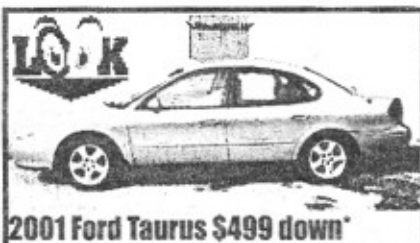

Heatstroke

vere difficulty breathing.

A rectal temperature over 104° (40°) after exposure to a hot environment.

Confusion, severe restlessness, or anxiety.

Fast heart rate.

Hot, dry, flushed skin with no sweating (classic heatstroke) or with excessive sweating (exertional heatstroke).

Severe vomiting and diarrhea.

Heatstroke is a medical emergency. Even with immediate treatment, it can be life-threatening or result in serious, long-term complications. After calling 911 or other emergency medical services, follow these first aid steps.

Move the person into a cool place, out of direct sunlight.

Remove the person's unnecessary clothing, and place the person on his or her side to expose as much skin surface to the air as possible.

Cool the person's entire body by sponging or spraying cool—not cold—water, and fan the person to lower the body temperature. Watch for signs of rapidly progressing heatstroke (below).

Apply ice packs to the groin, neck, and armpits, where large blood vessels lie close to the skin surface. Do not immerse the person in an ice bath.

Check the person's rectal temperature frequently, and try to reduce it to 102.3° (39.1°) or lower as soon as possible. The longer the body is at a high temperature, the more serious the illness and the more likely it is that complications will develop. Temperatures taken by mouth or in the ear are not accurate in this emergency situation.

If breathing stops, start rescue breathing.

Do not give aspirin or acetaminophen to reduce a high body temperature that can

occur with heatstroke. These medications may cause problems because of the body's response to heatstroke.

If the person is awake and alert enough to swallow, give the person fluids [32 fl oz (1 L) to 64 fl oz (2 L)] within the first 2 hours for hydration. However, a person with heatstroke may have an altered mental status and may not be able to safely drink fluids without help.

There are precautions that can help protect you against the adverse effects of heat stroke. These include:

Drink plenty of fluids during outdoor activities, especially on hot days. Water and sports drinks are the drinks of choice; avoid tea, coffee, soda and alcohol as these can lead to dehydration.

Wear lightweight, tightly woven, loose-fitting clothing in light colors.

Schedule vigorous activity and sports for cooler times of the day.

Protect yourself from the sun by wearing a hat, sunglasses and using an umbrella.

Increase time spent outdoors gradually to get your body used to the heat.

During outdoor activities, take frequent drink breaks and mist

yourself with a spray bottle to avoid becoming overheated.

Try to spend as much time indoors as possible on very hot and humid days.

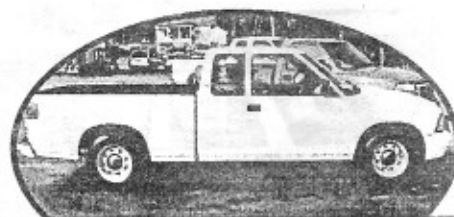

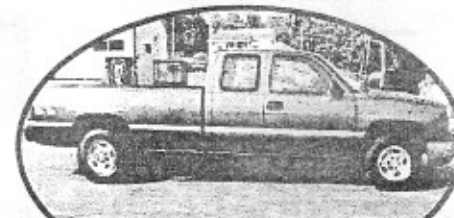
