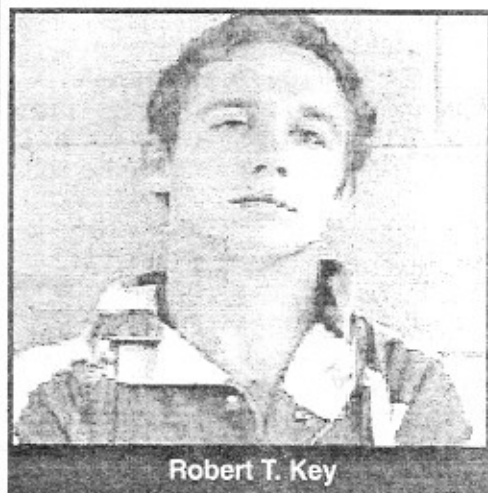
Upon arrival Deputy Bowen spoke with Mr. Hicks and the victim. Mr. Hicks stated he went to the residence

to retrieve some personal items. Mr. Hicks had a smell of an alcoholic beverage about his person and stated he had been drinking the night before and had been asleep. Mr. Hicks stated they needed to search his ex-wife's vehicle and the house for marijuana.

The officer then spoke with the victim who stated Mr. Hicks had come to her residence upset with the proceedings with the real estate transactions from the divorce. Mr. Hicks made entry into the residence and was asked to leave.

A witness stated Mr. Hicks did exit the residence and walk back downstairs to where his vehicle was parked. The victim's vehicle was parked next to his. The officer then opened the driver's door and under the driver's seat was a small plastic bag containing a green leafy substance believed to be marijuana. Upon further search there was no evidence of drug use.

The officer then asked Mr. Hicks to search his vehicle and he consented. Upon searching the vehicle the officer found a small plastic bottle with several half burned hand rolled cigarettes with a green leafy substance believed to be marijuana. Also found in the vehicle was a small straw, along with 4 unidentified bottles with an eye dropper inside, a liter of Vodka and a

pack of rolling papers. All items located in the vehicle belonged to Mr. Hicks.

The witness further stated Mr. Hicks said he would see them go to jail as he showed them a long brown tray located on the railing on the front porch, which contained a pack of rolling papers and a set of scales. These items were identified as the items shown to the witness by Mr. Hicks.

and security standards are maintained while each fishing event is being held. The fishing program will be similar to the HSAAP deer hunting program in that individuals interested in fishing on the plant will apply for the opportunity to fish and will be selected by a random drawing. There will be four fishing events held on the plant this year that are scheduled for: Saturday, September 1; Sunday, September 2; Saturday, September 8; and Sunday September 9. Participants will have approximately 7 hours to fish during each event.

The following guidelines will be implemented during each event. All fishing will be done from the bank

or by wading and no boats will be allowed during any event. This will be a catch-and-release program and participants will not be allowed to keep any fish they catch. Participants will not be allowed to use live bait such as minnows, crayfish, etc. Each participant will be required to bring and wear an approved life jacket at all times while fishing. On the morning of each event, participants will be assigned specific sections of the river in which they may fish and will be monitored at all times by installation personnel. The quota for each event will be 16 participants. Two alternate participants will be selected for each event to replace no-shows. HSAAP will reserve the right to cancel a fish-

ing event if installation personnel determine that water conditions caused by rain events, etc. are unsafe.

Eligible participants must be at least 13 years of age (at the time of the event) and all participants must possess valid Tennessee fishing licenses and permits as required by state law. Minors (17 years and younger) must be accompanied by a non-fishing adult (21 years or older) during any fishing event. Due to the way in which fishing areas will be assigned, applicants are strongly encouraged to apply in a group of two, however, applicants may also apply individually. Applicants may not apply in groups consisting of more than two people. When applying as a

group, both applicants must request the same dates.

To apply, send an application and application fee to: Holston Army Ammunition Plant, Attn: Fishing Program, 4509 West Stone Drive, Kingsport, Tennessee 37660.

The following data is required by the Privacy Act of 1974 Authority 10 U.S.C. 3013 and E.O. 9397. This data will be used to distinguish individual applicants for the installation fishing program. Disclosure of your social security number is voluntary. However, failure to provide your SSN may delay or disqualify the applicant from being issued a fishing permit on the installation.

An application will

consist of a note (preferably on an index card) with the individual's name, address, age, social security number, phone number, and a list of the dates requested in order of preference.

Applicants should include a \$3 nonrefundable application fee per person with their application. The application fee must be paid with a Money Order or Cashiers Check made payable to: A DAO, Rock Island@. Personal checks or cash will not be accepted. Applicants who submit more than one application will be disqualified. If selected, applicants will be required to purchase an installation fishing permit for \$20 at a later date.
