Fatalities

Labor Day weekend. Both were 78-hour holiday periods.

Of the 11 fatal crashes handled by THP, seven victims were not wearing a safety belt. Three of the fatalities occurred in alcohol-related crashes, down from six in 2006.

Over the 2007 holiday 10 crashes were single vehicle crashes; 1 was a multiple vehicle crash.

Ten of the people killed were vehicle occupants.

No child passengers requiring child restraint devices were killed.

No motorcyclists were killed; but there was one ATV fatality - no helmet was worn.

The THP partici-

pated in numerous special enforcement initiatives aimed at reducing fatalities during the Labor Day weekend, including driver license and sobriety checkpoints, saturation patrols and speed enforcement.

Parkway

100,000 fans.

There are several alternative routes eastbound and westbound motorists can take into downtown Knoxville. Eastbound motorists on I-40 can take the Exit 386B (Alcoa Highway/US129) to either Cumberland Avenue or Neyland Drive. Eastbound motorists can also take Exit 387 (17th Street) or Exit 388 (Henley Street/Rt.441) to get to campus and downtown. Westbound mo-

torists on I-40 can take Exit 389 (Hall of Fame Drive) into downtown Knoxville or any of the other exits previously mentioned.

JWP has been closed since December 2006 for the demolition and reconstruction of several ramps, bridges and roadways as part of the continuing Smart-

FIX 40 project. The parkway is expected to reopen by the end of September.

SmartFIX40 is an accelerated construction process involving the complete closure of a primary roadway to allow around-the-clock work that is uninterrupted by traffic in order to dramatically shorten construction time, thereby reducing the long-term inconvenience to motorists.

During the Smart-FIX40 project, I-40 traffic through Knoxville will be rerouted onto I-640 for 14 months beginning in the spring of 2008. Local traffic will have access to downtown at all times during this closure. The closure of I-40 will avoid more than two years of traffic delays, lane closures and other frustrations by allowing construction crews to work on roadways and bridges without traffic.

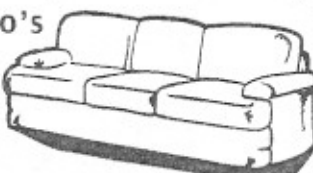

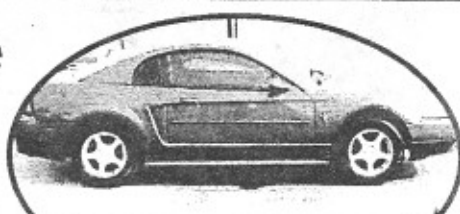
