Rape charges filed against local man

Police arrested a Loudon man Friday in connection with allegations he forced himself on an eighteen-year-old Greenback woman while attempting to rape her.

George Floyd Locklear, 43, of Steekee Road, was charged with rape while at the Loudon County Jail Friday.

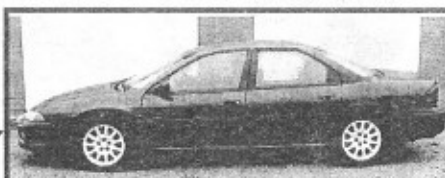

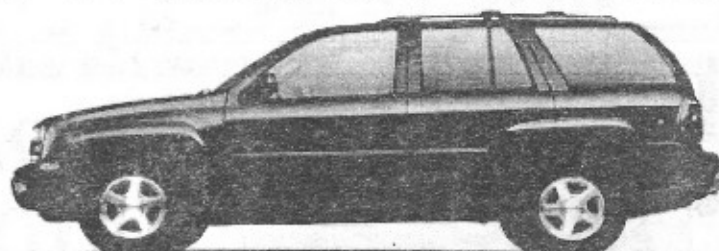
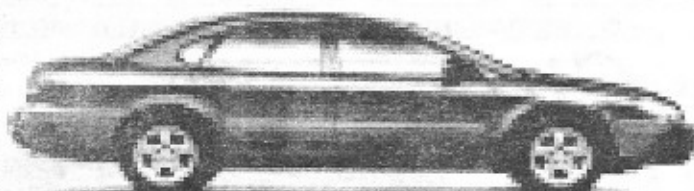
