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## McNally

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Every two years the members of the Tennessee General Assembly gather in Nashville to elect a speaker for each house and organize for the upcoming legislative ses-

sion. With the election of Sen. Ramsey as speaker of the state Senate and lieutenant governor of Tennessee, he has the authority to select committee membership and chairmen.

The Senate has nine standing committees that consider proposed legislation before it reaches the full Senate for final action. Each committee is made up

of nine senators, with the exception of the Finance, Ways and Means Committee and the Government Operations Committee that have 11 members each.

Serving his sixth term in the state Senate, Sen. McNally is the ranking member of the Senate Majority Caucus. He is a hospital pharmacist at Methodist Medical Center in Oak Ridge who previously served as Vice Chairman of the Finance, Ways and Means Committee, Chairman of the Education Committee, Republican Caucus

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Chairman and as a member of the Education Oversight Committee. In addition, Senator McNally will serve on the Fiscal Review Committee, Pension, Retirement and Insurance Committee, General Welfare, Health and Human Resources Committee and Rules Committee. He also serves as Chairman of the Study Committee on Open Government.

"We have a great opportunity and I am excited about the possibilities that are before us," commented Sen. McNally. "It is a privilege to be a part of the new vision and new direction of the state Senate."

According to records, Sgt. Jenkins and other officers including Officer Jon Yates and Sgt. Scott Newman executed the warrant at Viars's residence and Viars was the only one present at the time police entered the residence.

Found inside the home were several metal tubes with metal screen pushed into one end with burn marks on them, which are commonly referred to as crack pipes and are used to ingest cocaine. Several syringes were found in the house, including one containing what appeared to be blood in it.

Police further reported finding half of what appeared to be an 80 mg Oxycontin tablet for which Viars has no prescription, one blue pill, which appeared to be Xanax and for which Viars has no prescription and a small piece of an off-white rock-like substance believed to be crack cocaine.

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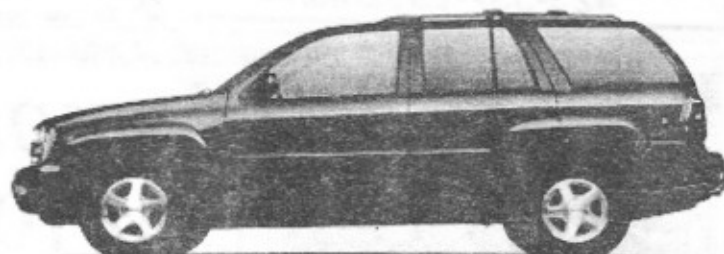
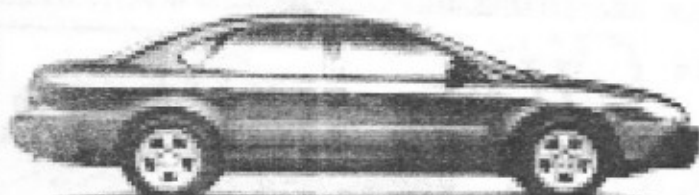
