# Loudon County Criminal Court Grand Jury Report December 10-11, 2007

This is the Grand Jury report for the December 2007 term of the Criminal court in Loudon County, Tennessee as reported by the Grand Jury on December 12, 2007.

Monday, December 10, a total of forty-four cases were heard and decided.

Tuesday, December 11, was devoted primarily to hearing the report of the investigation the Grand Jury requested of District Attorney General Russell Johnson in the August session. An investigation was requested because of charges brought before the Grand Jury by Joe Webb (Loudon resident), Randal Delbridge, Tim Boyd, and Ron Jones (members of the State Fire Marshall's Office). These charges were directed toward Loudon County Administrator of Schools Edward Headlee and Maintenance Coordinator David Hernelright for reckless endangerment in regards to "life safety issues" at Loudon High School since 2005.

As a result of the August Grand Jury meeting DAG Johnson predicated a TBI investigation into "life safety issues" at Loudon High School, which involved subpoening records and conducting interviews from and of members of the S. F. M. O., school system personnel and the various contractors.

DAG Johnson presented a summary of the TBI findings as well as the findings of the DAG investigation in the report. The report included pertinent written evidence provided to the jurors that followed a "power-point" presentation he conducted outlining timelines and events that occurred in reference to the case. Special Agent Jason Legg of the TBI presented his findings that mostly followed documented communications, or lack thereof, during the relevant times between significant parties involved. Loudon High School Principal John Bartlett, Mr. Headlee and Mr. Hemelright provided testimony and answered questions of the jurors.

The Grand Jury as a whole, after listening to a brief summary of the new information from Joe Webb, declined to hear any further testimony from Joe Webb and his witnesses.

To say this case was difficult to decide would be a gross understatement. After hearing approximately three days of various testimony (two sessions), studying various documents, and deliberating over three hours we could not reach the required consensus needed to recommend indictment. Therefore, the Grand Jury recommends no action at this time.

The remaining part of December 11 was spent by resuming our normal tours of the Courthouse, Annex, Justice Center, and County Jail. Much has been done in improving these facilities but there are still some things needing attention. These are our findings:

#### Courthouse

- 1. Handrails are needed on the east side of the Courthouse at the end of the walkway where the steps are located.
- 2. Security lights needed at least on the Annex side yard of the Courthouse.
- 3. A couple of conveniently located trashcans outside.
- Broken windows need repairing in upstairs storage room next to courtroom, 3 on front of building, and one on right side.

### Annex

- 1. Metal plate on sidewalk in back of Annex is a trip hazard, also crumbling concrete on back steps.
- 2. Stalls in both bathrooms downstairs have no usable latches.
- 3. Also suggested is a "call button" at the outside window instead of "sound your horn".

### **Justice Center**

- 1. Parking is still a serious problem on court days. (Wednesday)
- 2. More seating needed in courtroom 2.
- 3. Enhanced security systems needed especially for courtrooms.
- 4. Immediate need for 5 more patrol cars.

#### All Areas

1. There is still a need for all departments for a record, etc. storage facility.
