



The key changes to the sports fishing regulations include an 18-inch size limit for smallmouth bass on most state reservoirs. The exception is Kentucky Lake which will remain at 15 inches. The South Watauga, and Boone

Reservoirs will go to 16 inches in 2008 and 18 inches in 2009.

The TWRC removed the creel limit for spotted bass on Norris Reservoir. The spotted bass creel limit was increased from five to 15 for the upper end of Chickamauga Reservoir.

A 14-20 inch slot limit on the Clinch River was implemented for trout. For Douglas Lake, a size

limit of 16 inches was approved for sauger.

In regard to commercial fishing, the TWRC passed a proclamation recommended by Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency to leave the 36 inch length minimum for paddlefish through April 7, 2008. Remaining commercial fishing issues TWRC will be discussed at the January 2008 meeting of the TWRC.



The Tennessee Aquatic Nuisance Species Management Plan is now available for public comments. Developed over the past three years by members representing state and federal governmental agencies, as well as nongovernmental organizations and private citizens, the main focus of the plan is to prevent, eliminate, and manage nuisance aquatic plants and animals in Tennessee.

In simple terms, Aquatic Nuisance Species(ANS) are aquatic and terrestrial organisms, introduced into new habitats throughout the United States and other areas of the world, that produce harmful impacts on aquatic natural resources in these ecosystems and on the human use of these resources. Nuisance species such as bighead and silver carp, zebra mussels, hydrilla. and Eurasian water milfoil top the list of more than 55 other species that either exist in our state or have the potential to invade it unless precautions are taken in the very near future.

As part of the approval process, public input is required before Gov. Bredesen can approve and send the plan to its final destination, the National Aquatic Nuisance Species

Task Force, for their approval. Once approved, Tennessee will become the 20th state with an approved plan and will become eligible for federal funds to help implement the plan. Send your written comments to: Bobby Wilson, Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency, P.O. Box 40747, Nashville, TN 37204. Comments will be accepted until December 1, 2007.

"The citizens involved in this effort contributed a great deal of time and effort for the sake of their community," said TDOT Commissioner Gerald Nicely. "US 321 in Sevier County is one of the most scenic roads in Tennessee and the recommendations by the citizens resource team will insure the road improvement project will fit into the environment."

Due to current funding constraints, a time frame for the construction of this project is not yet known. Also the East Tennessee Rural Planning Organization (RPO) will be instrumental in prioritizing the project into their regional transportation plan.

In the spring of 2003, Governor Bredesen and Commissioner Nicely targeted 15 of the state's most controversial road projects for re-consideration, including one underway on US 321, and requested that they be studied by the University of Tennessee Transportation Center for Transportation Research.

After the UT study results came in, TDOT announced in October of 2003 that the department would move forward with the US 321 projects, with modifications, and after a full study involving local citizens.

The US 321 Phase Two Citizen Resource Team was formed in 2004 and held 13 team meetings and three public meetings. The team's goals included developing a consistent overall theme along the corridor and creating a parkway feel for the facility.

According to the affidavit, Fritts was convicted of domestic violence x2, assault by DV, PODP, DUI 1st, viol. of insurance law, DOSL, SP and VOP and was sentenced to probation for 11 months 29 days.

Since then he has failed to report to probation officer; failed to pay costs/fines, owes \$3770.50; failed to pay supervision fees, owes \$90; failed to provide current address, failed to attend DUI school, failed to respond to notices, failed to complete A/D assessment and has new charges in June 2007.

Deputy Chad Petty, LCSD made the arrest.

Candace Sue Davis, 38, of Morganton Road, Greenback, was charged with DUI and implied consent.

According to the report, Davis was stopped after speeding 59mph in a 40mph zone. She had a strong odor of an intoxicating beverage on her person and refused a BAC test.
