

ters. Several subjects fled into the wooded area surrounding the outbuilding. Officers observed marijuana paraphernalia and open alcohol in plain view in the area of the outbuilding. Sqt. Billy Hall, LCSD Narcotics Division (ND) was called to the scene by Assistant Chief James Davis II. On scene the owner was asked for permission to search and it was given. All of the subjects that fled were located after a search of the area. All of the subjects except one were under the age of 21; two of those were under 18. All of the subjects had been consuming alcohol and/or marijuana.

A search of the area

around the outbuilding produced a large amount of marijuana; approximately 22 grams, hidden in the top desk drawer, along with 2 bongs and several pipes used to consume marijuana were laying on top of the desk.

While talking with the two juveniles they both admitted to smoking marijuana and drinking alcohol. The property owner stated his son; Corbin Greg had been sleeping in the outbuilding. Several of the subjects at the location advised the marijuana belonged to Corbin Greg along with the bongs and pipes. Corbin Greg refused to give statements.

At least one of those involved was transported to the ER due to their level of intoxication.

Corbin Greg, 19, of Turkey Pine Lane, Lenoir City, was charged with felony possession of marijuana, possession of drug paraphernalia, underage consumption of alcohol, and contributing to the delinquency of minors. Sgt. Billy Hall, LCSD ND made the arrest.




