



from the original developer of Rarity Bay down to the current property owners for every lot of the development that lies within Loudon County.

Johnson stated that he has now "completed a thorough review of the results of this records examination, the information provided to me by the current Property Assessor and information from other sources, as well as the information gathered in the preliminary interviews. As a result of this review I have predicated an investigation of all of the issues surrounding these transactions, including the allegations of 'developer discounting' to the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation".

Once the TBI investigation is concluded and its results are available. Johnson stated that he intends to review them with the Director of the Tennessee District Attorney Generals Conference, the State Attorney General and the Director of the Division of Property Assessment, After meeting with the TBI District Supervisor earlier today to 'predicate the investigation' Johnson further advised that he was 'cautioned' by TBI that, even with much of the preliminary work concluded, this investigation might still take a considerable amount of time given the complexity of the issues and the number of people to be interviewed or re-interviewed.

Johnson indicated that no action will be taken until the full TBI investigation is complete.

Collections

2007 collections.

Sales and use tax collections totaled \$553,626,710, a decrease of \$19,619,177 or 3.4 percent from September 2007 collections.

Collections from the retail trade group decreased 3.8 percent. Items with significant changes include:

Miscellaneous retail: up 6.4 percent

Motor vehicle dealers and service stations: down 13.3 percent (with a 17.0 percent decline in the new, used motor vehicle sub-category item)

Building materials: down 14.0 percent

Collections from the service group decreased 8.7 percent from September 2007. The biggest contributor to the decline is personal services, down by 62.8 percent.

Collections from the nonretail, non-services group decreased 3.2 percent led by lost in manufacturing (down 10.2 percent), communications (down 5.3 percent) and wholesale trade (down 4.9 percent).

Consumer use collections were \$269,865, an increase of \$5,558 (2.1 percent) from September 2007.

Franchise and excise tax collections were \$243,528,781, a decrease of \$51,134,480 or 17.4 percent when compared to September 2007. Separately, franchise tax collections were \$92,807,201, a drop of \$10,101,521 or 9.8 percent from last September.

Excise tax collections were \$150,721,580, a decrease of \$41,032,960 or 21.4 percent from September 2007.

Tobacco tax collections were \$27,319,827, an increase of \$6,713,803 or 32.6 percent over the collection of September 2007.

Gross receipts tax collections were \$30,413, a decrease of \$114,231 or 79.0 percent compared to September 2007.

Privilege tax collections were \$19,431,871, a decrease of \$5,840,374 or 23.1 percent compared to September 2007.

Gasoline tax collections were \$51,141,858, a decrease of \$4,911,809 or 8.8 percent compared to September 2007.

Motor vehicle registration tax collections were \$19,909,113, an increase of \$131,577 or 0.7 percent compared to September 2007.

Inheritance and estate tax collections were \$6,820,740, a decrease of \$742,080 or 9.8 percent from September 2007.

The Department of Revenue collects approximately 92 percent of total state tax revenue. During the 2007-2008 fiscal year, the department collected \$11.2 billion in state taxes and fees. In addition to collecting state taxes, \$1.9 billion of local sales tax was collected by the department for local governments during the 2007-2008 fiscal year. Besides collecting taxes, the department enforces the revenue laws fairly and impartially in an effort to encourage voluntary taxpayer compliance. The department also apportions revenue collections for distribution to the various state funds and local units of government. 


