revoked license.

Investigator Yokley and Sgt. Hall stopped the vehicle and Underwood was taken into custody. While taking Underwood into custody the officer could smell the odor of marijuana emitting from the vehicle.

After removing the occupants including Perry Billingsley, who was seated in the rear passenger side seat, the officer deployed K9 Draga around the vehicle. Draga alerted and a search of Billingsley's person produced an off white rock like substance believed to be cocaine base from his pocket. Found under the corner of where Billingsley was seated was a glass pipe used to smoke cocaine base. The amount of cocaine base was less than 1 gram.

The report also noted Billingsley is a well-known consumer of cocaine base.

According to the warrant on Nathan Underwood for sale and delivery of schedule II (cocaine), on September 23, 2008 in the evening hours, the ND purchased cocaine base from Nathan Underwood via a controlled buy using a confidential informant. The event took place on Beals Chapel Road and the informant was wired for audio and given US currency to purchase cocaine base from Underwood, The transaction was monitored and Underwood's voice was the person the informant was purchasing the cocaine base from.

The informant returned and produced a white rock like substance that field-tested positive as cocaine. The cocaine was more than 1 gram but less than 10 grams.

Nathan B. Underwood, aka Bubbie, 20, of Vale Street, Loudon, was charged with sale and delivery of schedule II and driving on a revoked license.

Perry Gordon Billingsley, 49, of Highland Avenue, Lenoir City, was charged with possession of schedule II cocaine base and possession of drug paraphernalia. Sgt. Billy Hall and Investigator AJ Yokley LCSD ND made the arrests and filed the charges.






