hicle crank and rev up the engine. The driver then began to brake torque the vehicle and then upon releasing the brake the vehicle began to yaw sideways all the way around the fuel island and continued on to the rear of the store.

There were several patrons in the store along with the deputy's child who all witnessed the action.

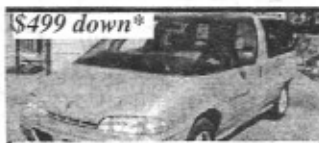

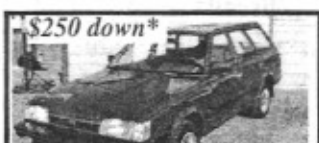

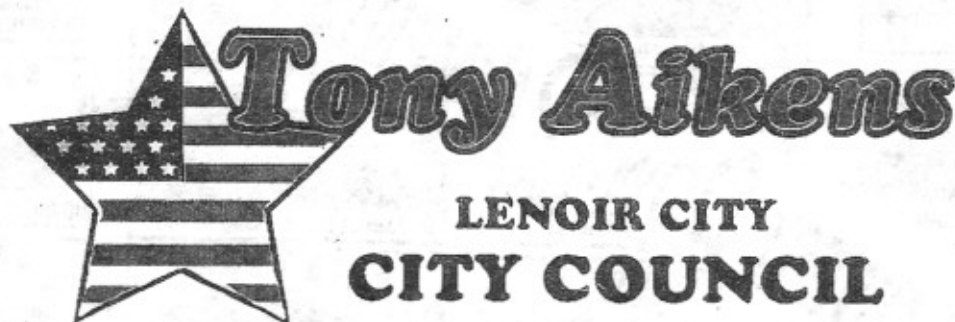
