

First, the TIF for the former Eldridge property has not yet ben presented in a dollar and cent manner that the shows the actual cost to the taxpayers of Lenoir City for unknown benefits. Also, approval of the proposal will open this tax break for any present of future developer.

Secondly, the proposal to move City Hall to the middle of town does not even merit consideration. There is not sufficient

parking downtown now for the businesses there, and there is simply no parking space for City offices and police.

The present City Hall has everything needed to serve its purpose, that is, easy

access, and is in a good location for people to transact their business. The city recorder office is well set up and already has the fire safe space that would be required at another location . along with the building inspector, veterans services office, city court, county clerk and large meeting.

One suggestion is to move the police

department to the City owned house and two lots at the corner of Grand Street and First Avenue. This move along would free up office space and considerable parking at no great expense to the City taxpayers. Since their acquisition by the City, those lots have been allowed to deteriorate to junk
