John Douglas Sheetz, 18, and Misty Ann Holmes, 17, were arrested for possession of marijuana with intent to deliver and posses-

sion of drug paraphernalia. "They're America's dumbest criminals," said Lt. Ricky Ramie, head of the Bay County Sheriff's Office narcotics task force.

Police in Covington, Louisiana said a teenage robbery suspect had eluded capture on several occasions, but they finally caught up with him and literally got him with his

pants down.

Police spotted the suspect standing on a street corner. After calling for backup, the officers closed in on the teen.

"They all converged on him from different directions," Lt. Jack West said. "He started to run, but his low-riding pants fell down and he stumbled to his knees."

"We literally caught him with his pants down," West said.

The teen was booked on warrants for armed robbery, carjacking, two counts of aggravated battery and being a child in need of supervision. His name was not released because he is a juvenile.

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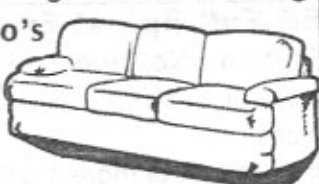

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## Registry

and have their names removed, TRA Chairman Eddie Roberson said Wednesday.

The TRA informs Tennessee residents every year that they may call the agency and have their names removed from the register.

People wishing to remove their phone numbers from the Do-Not-Call Register should call the TRA's Consumer Services Division at 800-342-8359.

The Do-Not-Call Register was established in 1999 by the Tennessee General Assembly and is open to residential telephone customers who may list their traditional and wireless phone numbers.

Businesses are not eligible for the program.

## Stupid Criminals

*What does a carjacker do when he steals a vehicle then gets lost driving it around? Why call 9-1-1 and ask for help, of course! That's what 31-year-old Claude King did after he carjacked an SUV in Boca Raton and drove all the way to Palm Springs, Florida.*

Police said King walked up to a GMC Envoy driven by Caroline Funkey at a traffic light just off Interstate

95 in Boca Raton, smashed the driver's side window and pulled Funkey out of the car.

He then forced the other four passengers in the vehicle out of the car, punching them to get them to leave. Perhaps finding five people inside the SUV caused King to become confused. Witnesses said King then started driving "wildly" around the area before eventu-

ally heading south on I-95.

While southbound on the Interstate, King collided with a pickup truck and apparently decided to turn around and drive north on I-95. He then collided with another vehicle before finally pulling over at an exit in Palm Springs.

That is when a frustrated King decided to call 9-1-1. The conversation went like this:

"Um, I committed a crime," King said. "I stole a vehicle."

When asked for his name, King said, "I'd rather do this: Could you just send the police over here?"

The dispatcher then asked where he was located, and King replied, "I couldn't even tell you. I don't even know where I'm at."

Palm Springs police found King sitting on the curb near the stolen SUV.

## Ridenour

Detective Jack Fine, Ridenour is accused of going to woman's West Third Avenue, Lenoir City home just after 6:30 p.m. on December 30, 2007 in spite of an active order of protection the woman has against him.

The woman told the detective she and a male co-worker were working on her house when she heard the screen door slam and then banging on her front door. She went to see who was at the door and saw Ridenour peering through her window, screaming and taking pictures.

Records indicate the co-worker told police Ridenour beat on the door and tried to get him to come outside to fight. Ridenour then got into the man's 2004 Jeep and did extensive damage to the dash and steering area.

Ridenour is also accused of calling the woman approximately 60 times throughout the day.

The lawman reported the order of protection against Ridenour was filed on June 6, 2007 in Jefferson County and doesn't expire until June of 2008. Ridenour has been served the final order and is restrained from assaulting, threatening, abusing, harassing, following, interfering, or stalking the woman or her children.

## Crock Pot Potato Chowder

Great for those cold nights.

Time to make: 1/2 day, 30 min prep

Makes 12 servings (3 quarts)

Ingredients:

8 C. diced potatoes

1/3 C. onions, chopped

3 (14 1/2 oz.) cans chicken broth

1 (10 3/4 oz.) can condensed cream of chicken soup

1 (8 oz.) package cream cheese, cubed

1/2 lb. bacon, cooked and crumbled

Directions:

1. Combine potatoes, onion, broth, and cream of chicken soup in crock pot.

2. Cover and cook on low 8-10 hours or until potatoes are tender.

3. Add cream cheese and blend.

4. Top with bacon and chives before serving.

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## Tasty Buns

No butter needed  
Time to make: 1 1/4 hrs. 1 hr. prep

Makes 12 servings

Ingredients:

5 C. flour  
2 pks. dry yeast  
1 C. milk  
3/4 C. water  
1/2 C. vegetable oil  
1/4 C. white sugar  
1 tsp. salt

Directions:

1. Mix 2 C flour & yeast.

2. In a separate bowl, heat milk, water, oil, sugar & salt to lukewarm in microwave.

3. Add all at once to flour mixture and beat till smooth.

4. Mix in enough flour to make a soft dough (2-3 cups).

5. Mix well, then turn out onto floured surface and let rest under a bowl for about 10 minutes.

6. Shape dough into 12 slightly flat balls and place on greased baking sheet (I actually prefer to use parchment paper--easy clean-up!) to rise till doubled in size.

7. Bake in preheat-

ed 400 degree oven 12-15 minutes.

## Fudge Crinkles

A Great 4 Ingredient Cake Mix Cookie.

Time to make: 15 min., 5 min prep

Makes 30-48 cookies

Ingredients:

1 (18 1/4 oz.) box devil's food cake mix (Betty Crocker Super Moist suggested)  
1/2 C. vegetable oil  
2 large eggs  
confectioners' sugar

Directions:

1. Preheat oven to 350°.

2. Stir (by hand) dry cake mix, oil and eggs in a large bowl until dough forms.

3. Dust hands with confectioners' sugar and shape dough into 1" balls.

4. Roll balls in confectioners' sugar and place 2 inches apart on ungreased cookie sheets.

5. Bake for 8-10 minutes or until center is JUST SET.

6. Remove from pans after a minute or so and cool on wire racks.

See why I'm a bit puzzled? Not much to choose from. It's hard to believe that this is the best American has to offer. Very disappointing for both parties. -Gus

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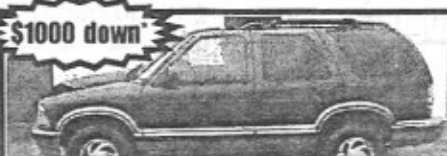
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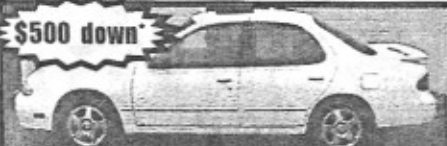

### Judging a Healthy Weight: Is There Truth in Numbers?

The government's official assessment of healthy weight is a number known as BMI or body mass index. What do those numbers mean and

are they the only measurement you need?

BMI is determined from multiplying your weight by 700, then dividing that number by your height in inches twice.

A BMI from 19 to 25 is considered healthy, while someone with a BMI between 25 to 30 would be considered overweight. Anything above 30 is considered obese.

But one size doesn't always fit all. Since muscle weighs more than fat, people who have more muscle often have a higher, yet healthy, BMI. Body mass index can provide an idea about your weight but an accurate assessment of your health also needs to include a review of your physical activity, growth and muscle mass.

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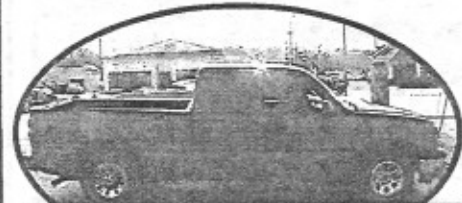
