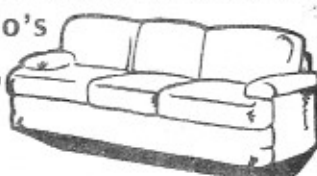

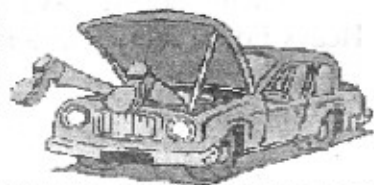

## Dog

dispatched to McDaniel Lane on an animal call and on arrival spoke with Melissa Hartline and Charles Ault. Hartline advised she was in her yard along Town Creek Road East when she saw her neighbor's dogs fighting in Ault's yard.

Hartline reported she went to Ault's property to break the animals up and while trying to separate them one of the dogs belonging to Ault bit her on her left middle finger. The bite broke the skin, causing it to bleed.

Ault reportedly also was trying to help break up the dog fight

and said the dog that bit Hartline belonged to him and the other dog, a Pit Bull, belonged to a man he identified as Jon Smallen.

Ault further reported he was watching the Smallen's dog for him and the dog broke his chain, got loose and that's how the fight started between the two dogs.

The officer reported Animal Control was called to the scene and both canines were taken into custody. Records indicate the dog that bit Hartline was to be put down and checked for rabies by Ault's consent and Smallen never came to the

scene to pick up his dog. Ault told police he no longer wanted Smallen's dog on his property.

Records indicate Hartline was advised to get her finger checked by a doctor as soon as she could.

No other information was available at the time of the report.

The preliminary recommendation calls for five bull elk tags, based on the current elk population. Four of the permits would be available to licensed Tennessee hunters through a quota permit drawing and one permit would be donated to a qualifying Non-Governmental

Organization (NGO) to be auctioned off with proceeds benefiting TWRA's elk program. All elk hunting would be restricted to the North Cumberland Wildlife Management Area.
