

On December 5. 2008, at approximately 3:17 p.m. Sat. Billy Hall, LCSD, stopped a 2009 Dodge Journey on I-75 North at the 83 mile marker for speeding and seat belt violation. While Deputy Shane Ezell wrote the driver Mcarthur Phillips, 35 of Pearland, Texas a warning citation, Sqt. Hall talked with the driver and passenger.

The lawman reported the passenger, 30 year old Brandon Winslow of Humble, Texas appeared very nervous and was trembling. The driver and passenger gave conflicting information while talking with them.

While Deputy Ezell continued record-

ing his citation, Sgt. Hall deployed K9 Draga around the vehicle. K9 Draga alerted in the area of the driver's door and the passenger's open window.

Sqt. Hall placed K9 Draga inside of the vehicle and she immediately went to the rear cargo area of the vehicle and alerted to a package that was wrapped in Christmas wrapping paper. The package was opened and discovered inside was two large packages of marijuana. The total weight of the marijuana was approximately 22 pounds.

Also discovered in a suit case that belonged to Mcarthur Phillips was a loaded 9 mm handgun. Phillips claimed ownership of the gun. Phillips nor Winslow claimed ownership of the marijuana.

Phillips was charged with felony possession of marijuana for resale, and possession of a weapon during the commission of a felony.

Winslow was charged with felony possession of marijuana for resale.

Along with the 9 mm, \$585 in cash was also seized in the stop.

"This was a good example of team work and the value of a well trained K9," said Sgt. Hall, "This makes all the long hours of training worth it."
