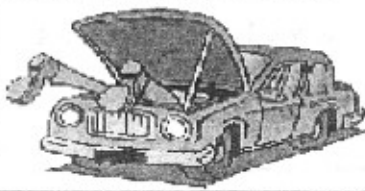

Report Beam is an internet web based program that was derived from an existing

software package that was used for reporting vehicle crashes and was modified to work in the modern day boating era. Report Beam allows the officer to convert the paper version of a boating accident report into a computer version. This conversion makes for better professionalism and accuracy.

The Report Beam program has the capabilities of diagramming state of the art 3-D animation and merging of maps to project a clear picture of the accident. Report Beam has significantly increased the efficiency of getting

the accident report to all the parties involved in a very timely manner. Another feature of this program is its query capability that can be helpful in projecting long term trends, making annual reports, zoning requests, judicial proceedings and assisting with legislative decisions.

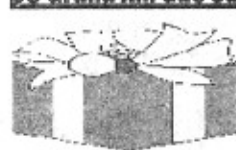
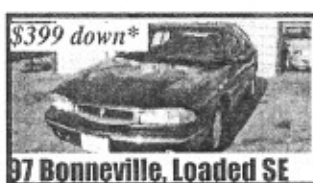

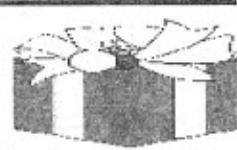
