
## Authorities to seek federal charges against Skipper

Charges pending against others at scene


Police have charged Jody Skipper with theft in connection with items found in his vehicle following a high speed pursuit that ended in Monroe County when Skipper crashed his vehicle into a parked semi trailer at a junk yard. Authorities are now seeking federal charges against him because one of the items was a firearm.

Police learned the items seized from Skipper's vehicle were stolen when Deputy Mickey Patterson, LCSD, responded to the Smallen Road residence of Samuel Thompson who said someone entered his home sometime between





Skipper was identified as a possible suspect and upon checking Deputy Patterson learned Skipper had been arrested the same night the theft occurred on an unrelated charge.
