

Charles T. Eblen will be laid to rest this morning at Lakeview Cemetery in Lenoir City at an 11:00 a.m. service. Mr. Eblen died Saturday at age 82.

Eblen was a fixture in the Lenoir City community for many years and was the longest serving Mayor in the history of Lenoir City after being elected to multiple terms.

Eblen was a natural born politician and was on the Tennessee State Legislature for the 8th District, and the Tennessee State Senate, as well as various other elected
