

Marilyn Kallet, poet and co-editor of the newly released anthology, The Movable Nest: A Mother/Daughter Companion (Helicon Nine Editions), will read and lead discussions at the March 6, 7 p.m. meeting of the Knoxville Writers' Guild on the task of letting daughters go.

The meeting, which is open to the public, is in the Laurel Theatre at the corner of Laurel Avenue and 16th Streets in Forth Sand-

Kallet and three contributors to the The Movable Nest, Linda Parsons Marion, Jessie Janeshek and Pamela Schoenewaldt. all Guild members. will read pieces from the book concerning mothers and daughters and their task of creatively separating from one another. The anthology includes poetry, essays, letters, and short fiction.

"The mother/daughter bond is so tight and so complex. We don't have many good guidelines on letting go. There's no handbook on letting go.

Maybe that's what this book is," said Kallet.

"My mother had a hard time letting go of me and my sister. She never forgave us for leaving home. We were bound and determined to do better than that."

Kallet said her own daughter's decision to leave home at age 16 to board at The North Carolina School for the Arts "broke my heart." But Kallet and her husband let her go. That daughter is now a graduate student at the Medill School of Journalism at Northwestern. "My daughter helped train her parents on letting go," Kallet said.

The book got its title from an essay by Pat Mora, who described mothers' and daughters' voices on cell DAILY EDITION February 27, 2008 • Page 9

phones as "the movable nest".

The range of motherdaughter experiences in the book includes Schoenwaldt's short story portrayal of an adoptive mother who must somehow exorcise the birth mother who is hanging around the house in spirit. Schowenwaldt's story is entitled, "Tell Her, Then Go."

Co-editor with Kallet is Kathryn Stripling Byer, poet laureate of North Carolina. Others among the 53 contributors include Sharon Olds, Deedee Agee, both editors, Rita Dove, Alicia Ostriker, Joy Harjo, and Jamaica Kincaid.

Kallet's other books include Circe, After Hours, poetry from BkMk Press, Last Love Poems of Paul Eluard, translations from Black Widow Press, and Jack the Healing Cat, a children's book from Tellico Books, Kallet's poetry has been published in hundreds of journals including New Letters, Prairie Schooner, and Tar River Poetry. In 2005, she was inducted into the East Tennessee Literary Hall of Fame in Poetry. Kallet directed the creative writing program at the University of Tennessee for seventeen years, and now holds a Lindsay Young Professorship in English.


