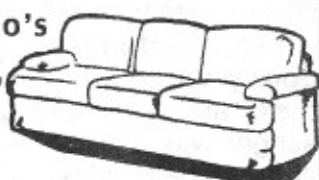

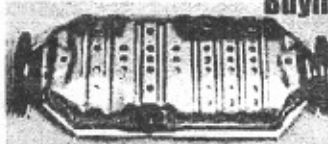

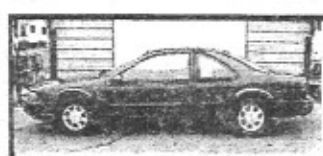

Tour of Original Homes in Historic Norris, Tennessee

Norris, - Built in 1934 to house workers for Norris Dam, the Tennessee Valley Authority's first dam, the small town of Norris was a planned community whose

unique features still exist. A tour of original homes in historic Norris will take place on Saturday, May 10, from 2-5 p.m. The town of Norris is located north of Knoxville off I-75, two miles east of Exit 22. Cost of the tour is \$15 per person; children under 12 admitted free.

"I've lived in the same town, in the same house, with the same woman for 50 years. I love them all," proclaimed beloved area writer Carson Brewer in his June 1999 newspaper column. Brewer went on to describe purchasing the stone bungalow in the town of Norris and living there with "Miss Alberta" where they raised son Kit. "The house is a little gray stone box that made us want to live in it the first time we saw it."

This 600 square foot charmer has remained virtually unchanged from when it first delighted the Brewers. It is one of six homes that will be opened to the public during the Tour of Original Homes in Norris. Homes on the tour will feature a cross-section of the twelve original house plans, one of which is the "dogtrot".

The idea of a planned community designed to promote social interaction and community cooperation was very in-

novative for the 1930's. TVA planners Tracy Augur, Earl S. Draper and Benton MacKaye, the TVA Regional Planner who created the concept of the Appalachian Trail, adapted ideas from England's garden city movement of the 1890's. Today the town of Norris very much reflects the planners' goal of a small, friendly Appalachian village.

Visitors to the Home Tour will be able to experience Norris the way the original planners intended, by walking along tree-lined sidewalks that hug the contour of the land. The Home Tour will begin at the Norris Lions Pavilion on East Norris Road located in front of the Norris Middle School. The Norris Historical Museum will also be open for viewing and staffed by town residents.

Participants are encouraged to enjoy walking the tour; however, a shuttle will also be provided. The Tour of Original Homes in Historic Norris is sponsored by the Norris Religious Fellowship Youth Group with all proceeds supporting their upcoming mission trip to Guatemala this summer.
