



District Attorney General presents 92 cases to Grand Jury – Backlog Now Eliminated

example, after the August 2006 Grand Jury there contained almost 300 individuals with approximately 650 charges on the 'continued on bound over' docket. This docket is added to each Wednesday as cases are constantly bound over or waived from General Sessions Court. Thus, the additional backlog caused cases to linger in the Criminal Court system for three, four and even five years. Johnson added that, after this term of the Grand Jury, the 'continued on bound over' docket contained only twenty-four individu-

Of the cases that were presented it is anticipated that the Grand Jury Report released today will show that eighty-nine individuals were indicted either on 'true bills' or 'new bills'. True Bills are indictments on cases that have already appeared in General Sessions Court and were either bound over to the grand jury after a preliminary hearing or waived to the grand jury by the defendant. jury, "usually the more serious felonies like sex offenses or larger drug cases", explained General Johnson. The names of individuals indicted under a new bill will not be released until they are picked up for arraignment by law enforcement because they have not been previously arrested and placed under bond.

Of the cases presented, the Grand Jury returned an indictment for two counts of vehicular homicide in a case where two individuals died as the result of a high speed. head-on collision on Maple Hill Road in November 2006. There were multiple count indictments returned on the cases involving

the rash of burglaries and thefts last summer in the Duff-Turner Estates/Hines Valley Road area. Two individuals were indicted on charges involving sex offenses with victims who were minors. There were approximately twenty indictments for DUI and twenty-five involving drug charges. One indictment included six charges involving TennCare Fraud/Identiv Theft.

In addition to these cases there are about twenty cases not presented that were either waived or bound over from General Sessions that are set to plead guilty by information within the next month.

Johnson thanked

the members of the Grand Jury, Lisa Niles and Debbie Hart of the Clerk's Office and his staff members who worked extra hard to prepare the large number of indictments.

Shop tax free in Tennessee

Nashville, - The Department of Revenue reminds Tennesseans that the special, one-time Sales Tax Holiday begins Friday, April 25 at 12:01 a.m. and ends Sunday, April 27 at 11:59 p.m.

"Each of the 2007 sales tax holidays provided almost \$10 million in tax savings to Tennessee families," said Revenue Commissioner Reagan Farr. "I hope that everyone will take advantage of this year's special three day weekend of tax savings."

This holiday provides statewide taxfree purchases for school supplies, art supplies and clothing priced \$100 or less per item and computers priced \$1,500 or less. This holiday also includes purchases of qualified items sold via mail, telephone, e-mail or Internet if the customer orders and pays for the item and the retailer accepts the order during the holiday for immediate shipment, even if delivery is made after the exemption period.

The Department of Revenue collects approximately 92 percent of total state tax revenue. During the 2006-2007 fiscal year, the department collected \$11 billion in state taxes and fees. In addition to collecting state taxes, \$1.9 billion of local sales tax was collected by the department for local governments during the 2006-2007 fiscal year. Besides collecting taxes, the department enforces the revenue laws fairly and impartially in an effort to encourage voluntary taxpayer compliance. Iron Needs for Women

Iron is an important component to healthy red blood cells that keep the body energized. But consuming enough iron is often a struggle for many women.

Animal foods such as meat, poultry and fish are high in iron. Women who limit or avoid meat may find that getting enough iron every day is a challenge. The good news is that you can get the daily recommended amount of iron by making careful food choices.

Most grain foods such as cereals, pasta, rice and bread are now fortified with iron. Foods that are naturally high in iron include beans (pinto, kidney, black), lentils, split peas and spinach. The form of iron found in meat is more readily absorbed by the body than the iron in plant foods.

However, you can increase the amount of iron that's absorbed from all food sources by consuming vitamin C-rich foods along with foods high in iron.

Good vitamin C choices include orange juice, red and green bell peppers, broccoli, strawberries, tomatoes and potatoes.
