

### Thieves

LCSD, responded to a residence along Big Hill Road where he spoke with a sixtynine vear old woman who said she had left Saturday to go be with her husband who is admitted into the hospital and when she came home Monday night she found her front window broken out where someone had thrown large rock through it.

The woman said she went inside and found her house had been gone through with things thrown out of drawers and cabinets, and her closets had been ransacked. She discovered some jewelry, a coin collection and three rifles, a SKS with wood stock. a .22 bolt and a .22 semiautomatic, had been stolen.

The lawman reported he left a lost listing form with the woman so she could go through her home better when she had time to settle down from the hospital. The value of the loss was unknown at the time of the report.

Stupid Criminals


