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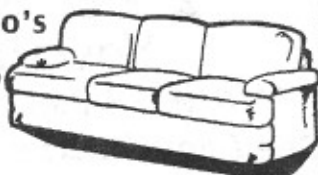
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Checks

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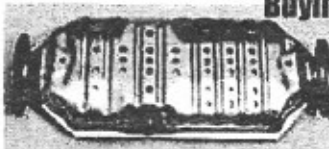
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Thieves

LCSD, responded to a residence along Big Hill Road where he spoke with a sixty-nine year old woman who said she had left Saturday to go be with her husband who is admitted into the hospital and when she came home Monday night she found her front window broken out where someone had thrown large rock through it.

The woman said she went inside and found her house had been gone through with things thrown out of drawers and cabinets, and her closets had been ransacked. She discovered some jewelry, a coin collec-

tion and three rifles, a SKS with wood stock, a .22 bolt and a .22 semiautomatic, had been stolen.

The lawman reported he left a lost listing form with the woman so she could go through her home better when she had time to settle down from the hospital. The value of the loss was unknown at the time of the report.

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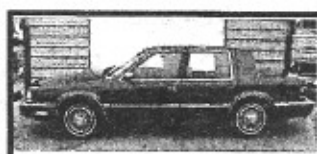

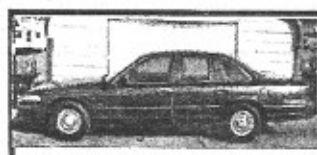

According to the report, while on patrol Deputy Craig Brewer, LCSD noticed a silver Acura traveling at a high rate of speed, 85mph in a 45mph zone.

VISION Engineering of Knoxville, Tennessee, will serve as the Civil Engineer, and Blaine Construction of Knoxville, Tennessee, will serve as the Construction Manager of the building.
