A young Lenoir City woman and a young Kingston man were apprehended by LCPD after they were found to have gone by several residences with a glass jar with a photo of a baby claiming the baby had a brain tumor and they needed money for a surgery. The story was bogus and the duo even had

juveniles help them in the scam. The baby in the photo on the jar is unknown.

Derek Lee Trimble, 19, of Paradise Lane, Kingston, was charged with theft under \$500 x3, and contributing to the delinquency of a minor.

Jessica Darlene Wilson, 18, of Waller Street, Lenoir City was charged with theft under \$500 x3, contributing to the delinquency

of a minor x2, violation of financial responsibility and violation of registration.

According to the reports, on or about May 5, 2008 Jessica Darlene Wilson, at three different residences on 6th Avenue, did drive door-to-door with accomplices and deceived and misrepresented themselves, as they took a glass jar door to door stating they needed money for a surgery. The jar contained a photo of a baby and the thieves claimed the baby had a brain tumor.

Wilson and the accomplices took money from victims at several residences on Sunday May 4th and obtained money by deceiving citizens of Lenoir City. Wilson is said to have put the photo on the jar and admitted to writing the label, which gave false information about the infant.

Wilson did take with her two juvenile females. The juveniles knew this was a scam to obtain money falsely.

Trimble and accomplices took money and checks from victims and he was accompanied by a juvenile female and he admitted he knew the story was bogus.

Sgt. Lynette Ladd, LCPD filed the charges and made the arrests.

Spring squirrel season here

Tennessee's spring squirrel season opened 30 minutes before sunrise Saturday, May 10, 2008. This year, the season will run through June 8, according to the Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency (TWRA).

As in fall hunting seasons, fox, red, and gray squirrels are allowed to be harvest-

ed, with a daily bag limit of 10 squirrels.

Several wildlife management areas are also open for spring squirrel hunting during this time. Some WMA's in East Tennessee with a spring squirrel season are: Buffalo Springs, Chuck Swan State Forest, Cove Creek, Kyles Ford, Nolichucky, Royal Blue, Sundquist, and Tellico Lake.

Hunters need to refer to the 2007/2008 Tennessee Hunting and Trapping Guide for specific regulations and license requirements.

Agents with the 9th Judicial Drug Task Force, John Sanchez and Brian Jenkins, under the direction of District Attorney General Russell Johnson stopped a vehicle and discovered the drug ecstasy (commonly referred to as X) along with marijuana in a vehicle on I-75.

According to the reports, Sgt. Brian Jenkins stopped a green Ford for a violation of registration. The temp tag on the vehicle was obscured by some type of tag frame and the officer could not tell what state the tag was from.

The driver was Courtnie L. Allen and she could not produce a license but

stated she did have a valid Kentucky license.

Marcus A. Hagans was a passenger and while running check, the officer received consent to search the vehicle from Willie Wells due to the fact the vehicle allegedly belonged to his girlfriend, who was not present.

During the search agents discovered small bits of a green leafy substance believed to be marijuana, commonly referred to as shake, throughout the vehicle.

The officers also found a small bag of the same substance and a baggie containing seven multi-colored pills without any markings which were believed to be MDMA (ecstasy or X),

which is a schedule I narcotic.

Both the bags were concealed in a bag of corn chips hidden under the back seat.

No one in the vehicle would claim ownership so all were charged.

Courtne Lynn Allen, 27, of Balltown Road, Williamsburg, KY, Marcus A Hagans, 21, of Fountain Avenue, Springfield, OH, Deandre Lamon Tucker, 28, of South Detroit St, Billfountain, OH and Willie James Wells, 33, of West Pleasant, Springfield, OH were charged with simple possession of marijuana and possession of schedule I MDMA (ecstasy).
