## Tennessee's April paycheck

Nashville, - April 2008 collections of the Tennessee Department of Revenue were \$1,391,939,718, a decrease of \$7,644,580 or 0.6 percent from April 2007 collections.

Sales and use tax collections totaled \$576,927,099, a decrease of \$24,554,304 or 4.1 percent from April 2007 collections.

Collections from the retail trade group decreased 6.4

percent. Items with significant changes include:

Motor vehicle dealers and service stations: down 13.1 percent (with a 17.1 percent decline in the new, used motor vehicle sub-category

Building materials: down 19.8 percent

General merchandise stores: down 3 percent

Apparel and accessory stores: down 9.9 percent

Collections from the service group increased 0.3 percent from April 2007. Only the business services category exhibited significant change (up 7.2

percent).

Collections from the non-retail, non-services group fell 5.7 percent led by losses in manufacturing (down 23.2 percent) and wholesale trade (down 6.1 percent) and partially offset by electric, gas and sanitary services (up 6.6 percent).

Consumer use collections were \$404,151, an increase of \$65,269 (19.3 percent) from April 2007.

Franchise and excise tax collections were \$378,521,947, a decrease of \$24,113,339 or 6 percent when compared to April 2007. Separately, franchise tax collections were \$144,077,990, an increase of \$1,632,720 or 1.1 percent from last April. The excise tax collection was \$234,443,957, a decrease of \$25,746,059 or 9.9 percent from April 2007.

Income tax collections were \$240,522,764, an increase of \$38,895,349 or 19.3 percent compared to April 2007.

Tobacco tax collections were \$23,861,710, an increase of \$7,028,145 or 41.8 percent over the collection of April 2007.

Privilege tax collections were \$20,996,806, a decrease of \$4,705,481 or 18.3 percent compared to April 2007.

Motor vehicle registration tax collections were \$26,855,923, a decrease of \$3,136,376 or 10.5 percent from April 2007.

What happened to the conservative party and their smaller government policies? Out the window, that's what happened to them. It's time for a third party, maybe even a fourth party.

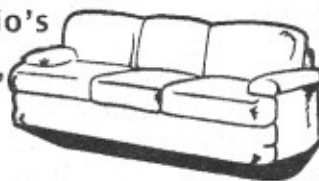

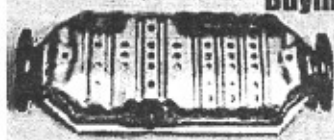

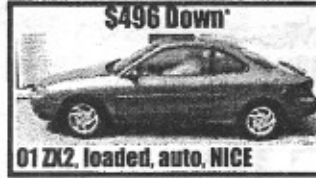
