

All four of the violent crime offense categories declined nationwide in 2007 compared with data from 2006. Forcible rape decreased 4.3 percent, and murder and nonnegligent manslaughter declined 2.7 percent. Robbery and aggravated assault offenses each decreased 1.2 percent.

By population group, cities with populations of 250,000 to 499,999 saw the greatest decline in violent crime (3.9 percent).

Violent crime in nonmetropolitan counties increased 1.8 percent, but in metropolitan counties decreased 1.7 percent.

Murder and nonnegligent manslaughter decreased 9.8 percent in cities with 1 million or more inhabitants. However, in cities with populations of 50,000 to 99,999, murder and nonnegligent manslaughter increased 3.7 percent.

Forcible rape declined in all population groupings. Cities with 1 million or more inhabitants experienced the greatest decline at 8.0 percent.

Cities with populations from 250,000 to 499,999 had the greatest decrease in robbery (3.0 percent). The Nation's largest cities, 1 million or more in population, also experienced a 2.9 percent decrease in robbery.

Aggravated assault decreased most (4.3 percent) in cities with 250,000 to 499,999 inhabitants. However, reports of this offense increased 3.0 percent in cities with 10,000 to 24,999 persons. Aggravated assault also increased 3.0 percent in non-metropolitan counties.

experienced drops in violent crime in 2007. However, in the South, violent crime increased 0.7 percent in 2007 when compared with data from 2006.

Local areas within the Eastern District of Tennessee such as Knoxville and Chattanooga showed an increase in violent crimes and property crimes.

These rough rankings provide no insight into the numerous variables that mold crime in a particular town, city, county, state, or region.
