## Complaint call lands LSD, DMT, MDMA, Weed and pills in bust

On June 16, 2008 at approximately 9:54pm Sgt. Lynette Ladd, LCPD responded to a complaint at Kings Inn. Upon arrival the officer made contact with Allison P. Murray and James Edward Fraser.

During the investigation consent to search the room was received and officers found approximately 23 squares believed to be LSD,

## Bust

a plastic bag with apples on it containing what was believed to be DMT (Dimethyl-tryptamine, 22 clear plastic capsules with a brown powdery substance believed to be MDMA, and two smaller plastic bags containing what appeared to be the same brown powdery substance. A set of scales was also located in the room.

Murray was placed under arrest. A search incident to arrest revealed \$2300 in cash, approximately 56 additional squares believed to be LCSD, a breath freshener bottle believed to contain liquid LSD, another plastic bag containing a green leafy substance and "buds" believed to be marijuana, a plastic bag containing 4 pills believed to be oxycontin, a pipe commonly used to some illegal drugs. Two separate bags containing pinkish colored pills believed to be ecstasy were located. Each of these

items was packaged in such a way believed to be arranged for resale.

Mr. Fraser had \$423 in ash as well. Fraser stated that he had just left the Bonnaroo Music Festival.

Allison P. Murray, 22, homeless, was charged with possession of schedule I "DMT" for resale, possession of schedule I "LSD" for resale, possession of schedule VI "marijuana" for resale, possession of schedule II "oxycontin" for resale, possession of schedule I "ecstasy" for resale, possession of schedule I "MDMA" for resale and possession of drug paraphernalia.

James Edward Fraser, 20, of Old Mashpaug, Sturbridge, MA, was charged with possession of schedule I "MDMA" for resale, possession of schedule I "DMT" for resale and possession of schedule I "LSD" for resale. Sgt. Lynette Ladd, LCPD made the arrests.

The revolver was found to contain five live rounds and had one spent casing. No

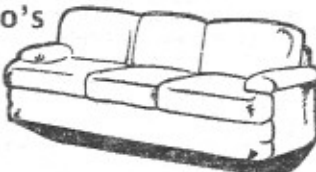

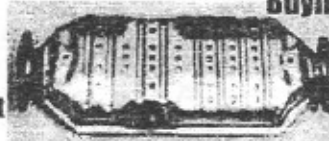
